Model Market Is Oldest Grocery in Cave Junction

Launched more than 15 years ago by Mr. and Mrs. C. L. Schumacher, the Model Grocery (or Schumacher's as it was known then), is the pioneer grocery store in Cave Junction. Destroyed in the disastrous 1933 fire, it was rebuilt by its original owners where it is located today.

The title "Model Market" was given the firm by O. W. Green, who purchased the store from Mr. and Mrs. Schumacher. The present owners, Mr. and Mrs. James C. Champion, purchased the establishment in August, 1944, from Mr. and Mrs. O. W. Green.

Mr. and Mrs. Champion now have the most complete line of groceries in the Illinois Valley, at reasonable prices.

The meat department in the store is leased from the Champions by the Grants Pass Provision Company, and is operated by C. E. McNamara. Bill Gillespie operated the department prior to the present owners.

Employed by Mr. and Mrs. Champion in the grocery are popular Mrs. Winston (Judy) Tuttle and Bill Raines. Besides McNamara, the meat department employs John Dunn.

O'Brien's Melody Lane Drive-In Restaurant

Paul Schneider will soon have his new "Drive-In" at O'Brien ready to open to the public. Like all other construction, Paul has been handicapped for this and that, but just about has the situation "licked" now and the new "Melody Lane" drive-in will soon open for business.
