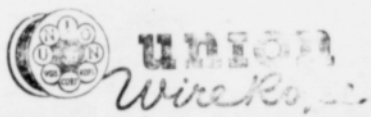

PROCLAMATION—WHEREAS,
the unregulated use of certain
forest areas is, in the judgment
of the State Forester, a menace
to life and property due to con-
ditions tending to cause or allow
the rapid spread of fires which
might occur or because of the inac-
cessible character of such areas
due to the lack of suitable roads,
and WHEREAS, upon the showing
of the State Forester it appears
to me to be necessary to close to
unregulated use the following
areas designated as: AREA No.
R-1—All National Forests in Ore-
gon and adjacent areas protected
by the United States Forest Ser-
vice as follows: Adjacent to Siski-
you National Forest: Secs. 29 and
32, T. 31 S., R. 11 W.; Sec. 30,
T. 32 S., R. 8 W.; T. 32 S., R.
9 W.; T. 33 S., R. 8 W.; T. 34 S.,
Rs. 8, 11 and 13 W.; T. 35 S., Rs. 8,
11 and 12 W.; T. 39 S., Rs. 8
and 12 W.; Sec. 31, T. 40 S., R. 8
W.; T. 40 S., R. 9 W.; T. 41 S.,
Rs. 8, 9 and 11 W.; Sec. 33, T.
41 S., R. 12 W. NOW, THERE-
FORE, I Earl Snell, Governor of
the State of Oregon, by virtue of
the authority vested in me under

the provisions of Section 107-210,
Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated,
as amended by Chapter 252, Ore-
gon Laws, 1945, do hereby pro-
claim the unregulated use of the
above-described areas to be un-
lawful and do hereby close said
areas and the same shall be sub-
ject to use only upon condition
that entrants shall comply with
all of the following requirements
or conditions: 1. To refrain from
smoking while traveling in such
areas. 2. To secure a permit is-
sued by the forester or a fire war-
den before building a campfire
other than at improved, designated
and posted campground on such
areas. 3. To have as a part of his
of her equipment when using
campfires, except when traveling
as a pedestrian, and/or camping
at improved, designated and posted
campgrounds, tools as specified by
the forester suitable for exting-
uish fires. This proclamation
shall be effective from and after
the 1st day of July, 1947, and
shall remain in full force and ef-
fect until and including the 31st
day of December, 1947. Done at
the Capitol in Salem, Oregon, this
26th day of June, 1947. /s/ Earl

Man-Caused Fires Can Be Prevented

W. J. Moyer, Keep Oregon
Green chairman for Josephine
County, has been asked to step up
activities of his fire prevention
committee for the next ninety days
in an effort to save millions of
dollars of forests and valuable crop
land. The urgent appeal for help
came from Dean Paul M. Dunn,
state chairman of Keep Oregon
Green.

"With proper care," Dean Dunn
said, "it will be possible to reduce
the annual average of 450 man-
caused fires in Oregon during the
next 90 days. Most citizens are
careful while traveling in the
woods, but we always have the
small friction who ignore all safety
rules and unknowingly start most
of our fires."

Dean Dunn urged the local
chairman to send out frequent

warnings during the summer in the
hopes that some fire destruction
can be curbed locally.

"Children of your county de-
serve special citations," Dean
Dunn said, "for the wonderful
spirit of enthusiasm they have
brought to the Green Guards and
Keep Oregon Green." I can only
hope that these young people may
be effective where every other
type of appeal has failed to reach
the minds of the deliberate de-
stroyers who drop fire brands
along highways and in our dry
woods."

Dean Dunn announced that
Charles Ogle, Salem, executive
secretary of Keep Oregon Green,
is now starting a state-wide tour
designed to reach every county.
Mr. Ogle will visit with Keep Ore-
gon Green leaders in nearly every
city.

A number of local citizens have
been asked by Governor Earl Snell
to serve on the county Keep Ore-
gon Green committee.

Hybrid Corn
In 1945 more than 58 million acres
were planted to hybrid corn vari-
eties, according to the department
of agriculture. Since 1938, when 15
per cent of the corn acreage was
planted to hybrids, there has been
an increase each year of from 5.7
per cent to 8.6 per cent, or close to
7 million acres. In the corn belt
states, hybrids are estimated to
have increased yields at least 20
per cent over the open-pollinated
varieties
