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Chin Up Club to Stage State Fund Campaign

Citizens of Oregon are to be asked to contribute to the state-wide fund drive beginning August 26 which has a direct and unusual appeal. It is being staged by "Chin Up Club of Oregon, Inc." the name itself indicative of its nature.

The "Chin Ups" are handicapped people who are striving to do something for themselves despite major physical handicaps. Their endeavors are well described in the statement of their president, Beth Sellwood, which follows:

"I have been confined to a

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wheelchair for 23 years. My whole body is afflicted due to a rare kind of muscular dystrophy. After we become 21 years old there is very little assistance we are eligible to receive such an education and medical care. If we aren't 65 years old, we can't get a pension. I have said there should be some kind of a place where the handicapped could go to be trained so they would become self-supporting and where they also could be given therapy treatment."

The club is not sufficiently strong financially to put on an elaborate state-wide drive. They, therefore, are asking interested citizens and organizations in the various communities to volunteer to aid personally and to develop local fund-campaign drives. They are selling card-board "bricks."

DDT Vegetable Residue Avoided if Care Taken

DDT applications can be made safely on most vegetable crops, except for spinach, lettuce and similar leafy vegetables, without leaving excessive residue if reasonable precautions are used, reports H. H. obinson, O. S. C. experiment station chemist, after two years of analyses made on experimental crops. His findings are contained in a mimeographed circular of information, No. 413.

The circular gives procedures that will keep residue accumulation well below the seven parts per million considered a safe tolerance. Although the poisonous action of DDT on humans is much lower than that of many other common insecticides, care is advisable to see that excessive residues do not remain at harvest time, especially in the case of commercial vegetables raised for market, says Robinson.

National Forest Receipts Exceed Six Million Dollars

Receipts of over six and a half million dollars for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1947, for the use of national forest products from the nineteen national forests of the North Pacific region of Oregon and Washington, have just been reported by the U. S. Forest Service, Portland, Oregon. Covering sale of national forest timber and other forest products, grazing fees, land uses, and water power, the total net received for the fiscal year is \$6,575,387.93. This is a substantial increase over the receipts for fiscal year 1946, which amounted to \$3,799,961.34.

Twenty-five per cent of all national forest receipts are returned to the state, for distribution to counties for roads and schools, and an additional 10 per cent is made available for forest roads, says the Forest Service.

Adult Summer Conference Set for Santiam Lodge

The first interdenominational Adult Summer Conference to be held in Oregon since 1941 will meet at Santiam Lodge, August 17-23, under the auspices of the Oregon Council of Churches.

The purpose of the conference which will bring together pastors, laymen and churchwomen from all parts of Oregon, is to train leaders in men's and women's work in the local churches of the state and for local church cooperation. Speakers will include prominent church council leaders from Portland, San Francisco and Seattle.

Work of state and local councils will be conducted by Mr. Harold Herman of Seattle, while women's council work will be led by Mrs. Helen Kincaid of Seattle. Men's and women's methods in the local church will be covered by Mr. Herman and Mrs. Jessie Bunch of Forest Grove. Dr. Ralph Walker of the First Baptist Church of Portland will be camp pastor and will lead the mission study theme, "Committed Unto Us".

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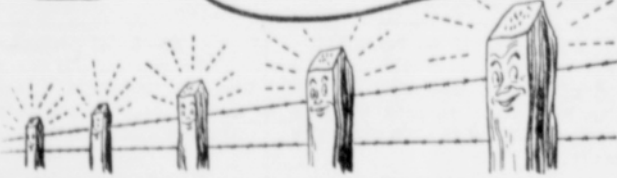
