Crime-Detecting Device Cleveland police department is the first in the world to use faxfilm as a crime-detecting device. With a narrow ribbon of plastic, softened by a liquid solvent, an exact negative impression of any scratch on a crime scene can be made in about 45 seconds. The record can be kept on file, and when a tool is picked up that could be the one figuring in the job, another set of scratches can be made in the same material and the two "signatures" can be matched.
