Mr. and Mrs. Chester K. Britten made one of their numerous trips to the valley to look after the ranch home near Bridgeview.

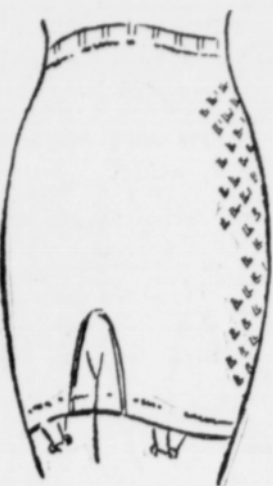
George Logan and Marjorie Logan filed an assumed business name in the county clerk's office last week for "Illinois Valley Pole Company."

County Court To Hold Bangs Disease Hearing

Petitions bearing 125 names of Josephine county dairy and beef owners asking extension of the Bangs Disease test to include beef stock were filed with the County Court this week by County Agent Jens F. Svinth.

The petitions were circulated under the auspices of the Jose-

phine County Pomona Grange.

County Judge W. A. Johnson announced that a public hearing on the subject would be held in the County Court rooms at 10 a. m., Thursday, November 13.

Under a law adopted by the '47 legislature, such tests were made mandatory for dairy cattle only, but procedure was set up whereby the County Court could require beef cattle tests.

Svinth said that 1946 tests showed 1.8 per cent of reactors among

Josephine county beef cattle. While Bangs disease does not damage beef for human consumption, extension of the test to all cattle aids in protecting all herds, he stated.
