Big Russian Increase

for all the live timber marked or
designated for cutting, and all
merchantable dead timber located
on an area embracing approxi-
mately 16 acres within Sec. 2, T.
41 S., R. 8 W., W.M., Siskiyou Na-
tional Forest, Oregon, estimated
to be 526,000 feet B. M., more or
less of Douglas-fir, and 6,000 feet
B. M., more or less of Ponderosa
Pine. No bid of less than \$7.90
per M feet for Douglas-fir, and
\$9.90 per M feet for Ponderosa
Pine will be considered. In ad-
dition to the prices bid for stump-
age a cooperative deposit of \$.50
per M feet B. M., to be used by the
Forest Service for paying the cost
of slash disposal, and a coopera-
tive deposit of \$.60 per M feet B.
M., to cover the cost of tree plant-
ing, seed sowing, and timber stand
improvement work on the area cut
over, for the total cut of timber
under the terms of this agreement,
will be required. \$1,000.00 must
accompany each bid, to be applied
on the purchase price, refunded,
or retained in part as liquidated

be 2,768,000 feet B. M., more or
less of Douglas-fir, 262,000 feet
B. M., more or less of Sugar Pine,
and 12,000 feet B. M., more or less
of Ponderosa Pine. No bid of less
than \$4.70 per M feet for Doug-
las-fir, \$10.60 per M feet for Sug-
ar Pine, and \$8.35 per M feet for
Ponderosa Pine, will be consid-
