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TRAFFIC VIOLATORS TO BE CHECKED ON

Oregon drivers having more than their share of accidents or convictions for traffic law violations will receive the close attention of the state driver's license division under an "accident repeater" program now being set up, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry has announced.

As a move to help stem traffic accident losses, motorists involved in three or more smash-ups during a 12-month period will be notified that their record has been transferred to a special file. Later reports of chargeable accidents or violations of traffic laws will be checked carefully, and the driver in question may be called for special examination and interview. His driver's license will be suspended if circumstances warrant, it was disclosed.

Drivers turning in clear driving records for the 12 months following receipt of a warning letter will be given a clean slate.

On a national basis, about four percent of all drivers are classified as accident repeaters, yet this group caused an estimated 40 percent of the fatal accidents in 1946.

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who should be in domiciliary institutions but there is actually 500 fewer beds for domiciliary patients than there were at the start of the last war."

John Walker Jones, chairman of the VFW rehabilitation committee, said that there are several hundred patients occupying beds in VA hospitals in Oregon and Washington who could be transferred to a domiciliary institution if Camp White were to be taken over. This would alleviate overcrowded conditions in the hospitals.

Oregon congressmen have introduced bills in the senate and house to provide funds for VA acquisition of the Camp White hospital.

MANUFACTURERS INDUSTRIAL QUESTIONNAIRE

A clear, complete picture of the current industrial situation in the Pacific Coast states, recording the vast changes which have occurred since 1939, will be presented in the tabulations of the 1947 Census of Manufacturers, to be taken early in 1948, according to Director J. C. Capt, Bureau of the Census, Department of Commerce.

Since the 1947 Census of Manufacturers is being conducted by mail, Director Capt urged all manufacturers to return their completed questionnaires promptly in order to speed up the avail-

ability of the results and keep the costs down.

The director pointed out that reporting in the Census of Manufacturers, which dates back to 1810, is mandatory. Information received cannot be used by any other government agency, it is strictly confidential.
