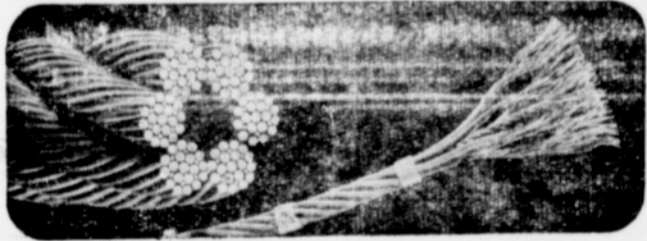

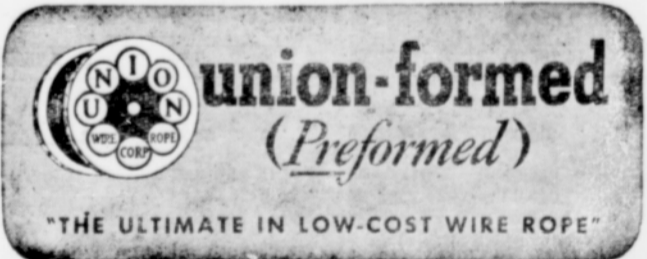

session of congress. Much of the big legislation has been cleared, or will shortly be disposed of. Under the hearing of "big legislation" would come the tax reduction bill, the modification of rent control, the European Recovery Program, and major appropriation bills.

In the near future, extension of the Reciprocal Trade Agreement program, renewal of selective service, a new bill to create a national science foundation, and a bill to authorize the beginning of a synthetic liquid fuels program may come up for consideration. The universal military training bill is, at present, on the shelf, but if the world situation grows much darker, it, too, may be acted upon during this session.
