Notice of School Election Upon Question of Increasing Tax Levy Over Amount Limited by Section 11, Article XI, State Constitution

Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in the School District of Josephine County of Josephine County, State of Oregon at the following school houses: Dimmick, Fort Vannoy, Fruitdale, Hugo, Jerome Prairie, Kerby, Merlin, Murphy, Oak Grove, O'Brien, Selma, Sunny Valley, Wilderville, Williams, and Wolf Creek; on April 26 from 2:00 to 7:00 p. m. in aforesaid school district, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the tax levy for the year 1948-1949 over the amount limited by section 11, Article XI, of the Constitution of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are: Increased number of pupils and increased costs of operating schools.
The amount of tax in excess of the 6% limitation, proposed to be levied for said year is \$253,315.53.
