Oregon Cherries Must Have OK for California

Plan quarantine regulations of California require that fresh cherries moved or sent into California from Oregon must be accompanied by a certificate showing that the cherries were grown in an area free from the cherry fruit fly.

The required certificates may be obtained without charge from resident representatives of the Oregon Department of Agriculture.

The Oregon counties designated by the California cherry fruit fly quarantine as being non-infested with cherry fruit fly are Baker, Coos, Curry, Jackson, Josephine, Lake, Malheur, Umatilla, and Wallawa.

Fresh cherries purchased in these counties may be admitted to California provided they are accompanied by the required Oregon Department of Agriculture certificate.

- 3—Resident of the state six months and resident of the district for at least thirty (30) days preceding the election.
- 4—Name **ACTUALLY** appearing on the 1947 county assessment roll. This applies to **EITHER** personal property or real property.

Voter may meet property qualification by presenting to the judges or clerk of election satisfactory evidence that he or she has stock, shares or ownership in any corporation, firm or copartnership which has property in the district, as shown by the last county assessment (1947) roll, on which such corporation, firm or copartnership pays a tax, even though his or her individual name does not appear upon the tax roll.
