QUALIFICATIONS OF VOTERS:

- 1—Twenty-one years of age.
- 2—Citizen of the United States.
- 3—Resident of the state six months and resident of the district for at least thirty (30) days preceding the election.
- 4—Name ACTUALLY appearing on the 1947 county assessment roll. This applies to EITHER personal property or real property.

Voter may meet property qualification by presenting to the judges or clerk of election satisfactory evidence that he or she has stock, shares or ownership in any corporation, firm or copartnership which has property in the district, as shown by the last county assessment (1947) roll, on which such corporation, firm or copartnership pays a tax, even though his or her individual name does not appear upon the tax roll.
