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MANY COWS ARE POISONED IN VALLEY

With the sudden and mysterious death of six cows in the Illinois Valley during the past several months as the result of grazing on poisoned pasture, Oregon State police have been asked to conduct an investigation into the death of the animals.

James Earle, co-owner of the Bar Head ranch, one mile south of Takilma reported that one of his cows recently was found dead in the Takilma flats. A cow owned by L. Castleberry of Bridgeview road was found dead one mile north of Takilma about July 1st.

Two cows owned by the Illinois Valley Dairy were reported to have died recently after they had eaten a quantity of clover. In all cases, the carcasses of the animals were bloated.

Poisoned weed was blamed for the death of two more cows on

the old Runyan ranch near the airport.

Several farmers here have advanced the theory that the animals died from eating poisoned grain used to exterminate digger squirrels.

HEALTH CLINIC

At the last clinic Dr. S. B. Osgood gave the following: diphtheria immunizations, 22 Shots; whooping cough immunization, three; 11 smallpox vaccinations; one adult conference; 2 infants examined and 9 children examined.
