SALE OF GOLD OK BY TREASURY DEPART.

As the result of a request of Representative Clair Engle of California, the United States Treasury Department recently handed down a decision that "gold in its natural state," may be bought, sold or hoarded by anyone.

The California Mining Journal recently reported that the first large gold purchase under the new ruling had been made by Frank Lilly, Spokane mining statistician and president of the American Hard Money Association, had bought 620 ounces for \$25,240 which represents \$6200 more than the U. S. Treasury would pay.

It was also reported by the mining magazine that many firms are in the market for natural gold at from \$45 to \$51 an ounce and this is expected to spur development of

SPECIAL SEASON TAGS ARE NOW AVAILABLE

Application for special season tags can now be obtained at all game commission license agents or at the office of the Oregon State Game Commission in Portland, it has been announced.

According to information received here, this year for the first time parties of not more than four persons may apply as a unit. To apply as a group, each member of the party must sign the application and members of the party cannot submit individual applications.

It has been further pointed out that a number will be issued to the group as a whole and in case it is necessary to hold a drawing and this number is successful, each person in the group will receive a notification to send the required fee, personal description and type and number of his 1948 hunting license.

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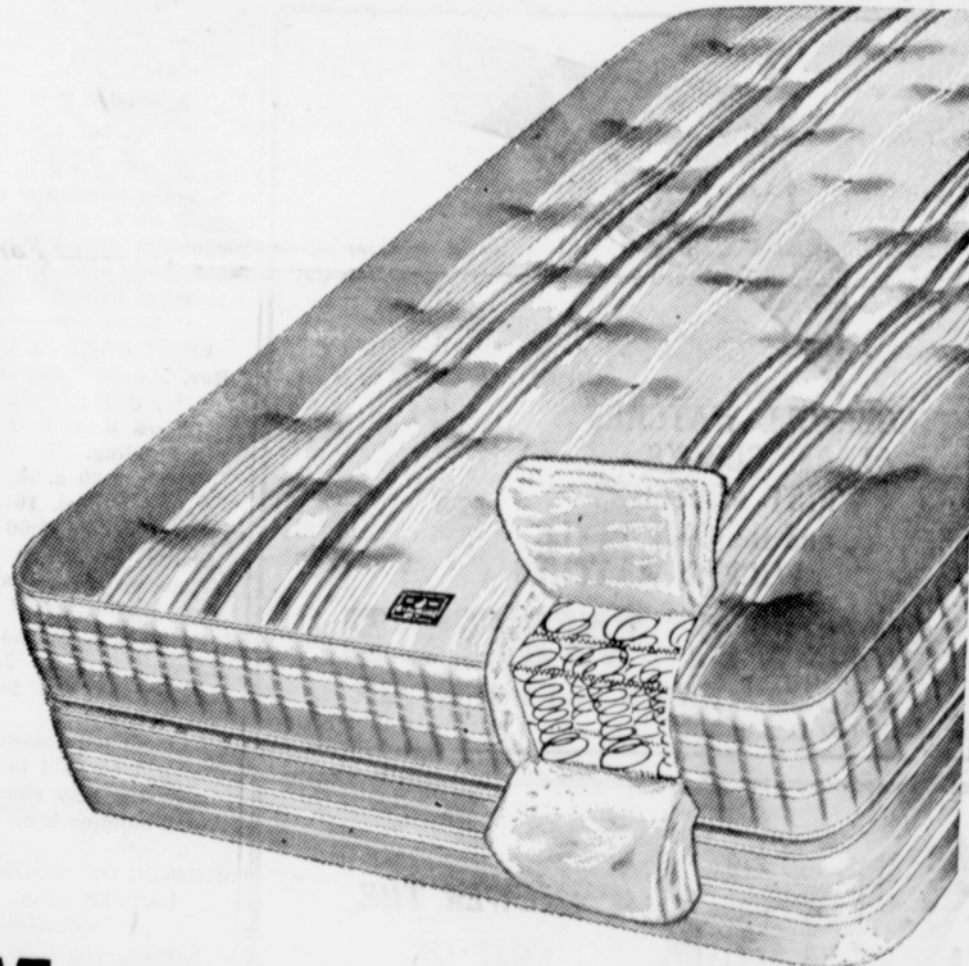


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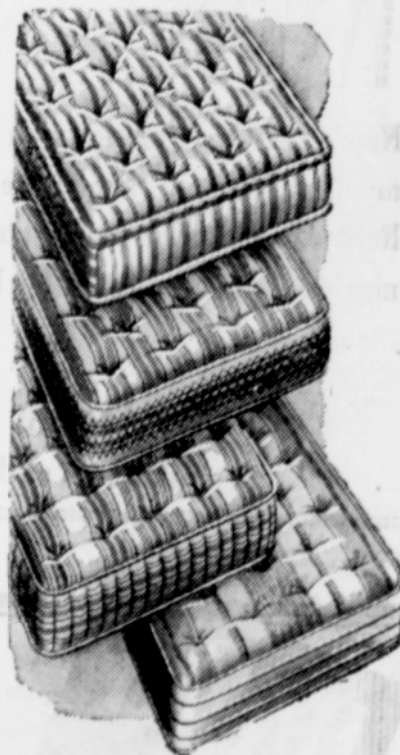
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
