Motor Car Registrations Break All Records

Oregon-owned motor vehicles continued to increase last month as total registrations reached 558,546, to set a new all-time high, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry has reported.

This marks another 10 per cent gain over the number registered at the same time last year, Newbry said. Passenger cars recorded the largest increase, numbering 423,232 as of July 31, for a climb of 38,712. Farm trucks jumped 13 per cent over the total for last year, registering 24,161 as against 21,111 in July, 1947.

State department reports show gasoline consumption is keeping pace with the registration increase, bearing out earlier predictions that car travel this summer would reach the highest peak in history. Almost three-fourths of the 40 lives lost in July traffic accidents were the result of crashes taking place in rural areas, Newbry pointed out, blaming open-highway speed as the most significant factor in this situation.

"We know beyond a doubt that exposure to accidents is greater than ever before," the secretary stressed. "Drivers must bear this in mind whenever a straight
