JAMES FARM HOME TO RECEIVE HELP FROM NATIONAL SOCIETY

Possibility that the James Farm Home for spastic boys, located at Bridgeview, a short distance from Cave Junction, will be given financial assistance for an expanded program by the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults, Inc., has been voiced by W. Theron Jones, field secretary of the organization.

The James Home was started last February and now cares for 12 boys ranging in age from 5 to 16. Present facilities can care for between 24 and 34 boys, it is reported. If approval of the state health department, now being sought, is placed on the home, plans call for further installation of equipment to aid in physical and occupational therapy.

BUILDING NEARLY COMPLETE

Site of the present home is the 70 acre farm of Mr. and Mrs. Geo. E. James at Bridgeview. A new building is in final stages of completion. One large first floor wing has been constructed to serve as class and recreational room. Second floor of the building will be used as a dormitory as soon as proper fire escapes are installed. The program calls for construction of a large swimming pool next summer, also a large concrete patio around the entire house to be used for skating and other recreational purposes.

Mrs. James relates that she became interested in conducting such a home some seven years ago when a child specialist treating her own son noted the progress the boy was making under her care and urged her to take a nine-year-old boy to train. The sum received from the parents of this boy for his care formed the nucleus for the James Farm Home. The boy, now 16, has improved sufficiently to be put in charge of chickens on the farm and is planning to specialize in poultry raising.

One of the fundamental principles underlying training at the farm, according to Mrs. James, is to build up each youngster's confidence and self-reliance. Each boy helps the others, and in the home atmosphere progress is often remarkable. The state department of special education provides a teacher, Mrs. Lucius Robinson, who conducts regular classes. School work is conducted on the same hourly basis as regular schools, the main difference being that pupils here are not graded.

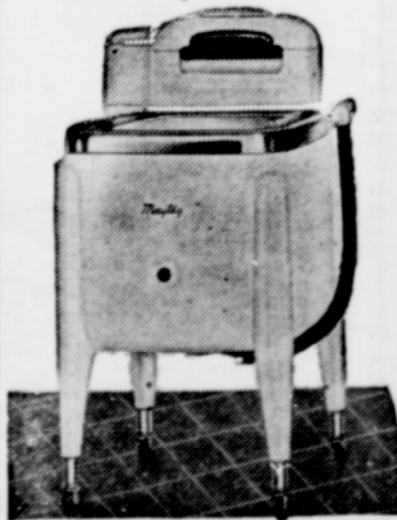

THEY CONSULTED PUBLIC INTEREST

In an economy where labor relations were ideal, it would not be necessary to congratulate the parties to an economic dispute for showing consciousness of the public's interest and welfare and a mature understanding of the collective bargaining process. But in an economy where there is all too little of that spirit the employees and managers of Pacific Greyhound Lines deserve to be singled out and praised for having shown it over the past week end.

It seems clear from the facts that are known—the terms of the new tentative understanding haven't yet been revealed or ratified—that there was a desire on both

sides to keep the public from suffering the discomfort and disruption of a strike.

Cheers go to the work of Federal Conciliator Omar Hoskins in skillfully bringing the labor and management contestants together during continuous negotiations which averted a seven-State tieup just 36 minutes before the deadline.

Eight thousand commuters around the Bay Area and 122,000 other daily passengers of Pacific Greyhound buses will take a new measure of confidence in the soundness of the collective bargaining process as a result of this sensible and adult demonstration by the bus workers and managers of how it ought to work.—San Francisco Chronicle.

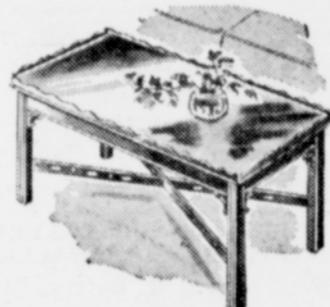

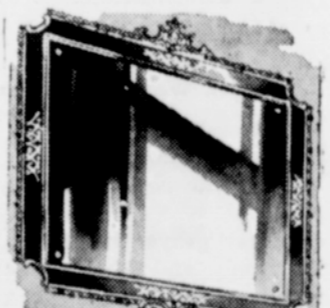

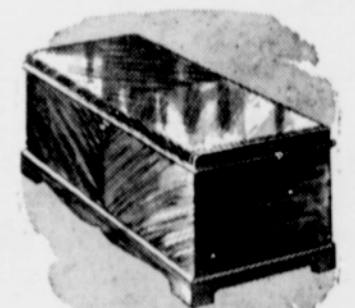
