SCHOOL BOARD LETS SCHOOL CONTRACTS

Contracts totaling \$146,048.50 for construction of kitchens multi-purpose rooms, health rooms, offices and additional classrooms at the Murphy and Fruitdale schools were let by the county school board last night to Settergren and Wiley company on construction and to H. E. Hawk, of Medford, on plumbing and heating for both buildings.

The construction bid for both schools was \$110,300. One for plumbing and heating, including that in the new additions, was \$35,748.50.

One additional classroom will be added at the Fruitdale school and two at the Murphy school, L. C. Moffitt, superintendent, said.

The bid of the First National Bank was accepted on the \$300,000 worth of school bonds offering a premium of one cent per hundred with interest at four per cent on bonds maturing in two years; two per cent on those maturing during the next three years; and two and one half per cent on those maturing during the remaining five years of the 10 year issue.

A higher bid was also received from the United States National Bank, Moffitt said.

Of the \$700,000 bonds voted this year for school construction \$409,000 will remain after the contracts let last night to construct a four classroom school at Jerome Prairie, a high school at Cave Junction, a kitchen unit at Oak Grove, and improvements to the Vannoy and Merlin school plants.
