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Work On Old CCC Camp This Month

Repair and remodeling of the old Grayback CCC camp for use by the 4-H and Homemakers for summer camps and by other organizations will get under way this month. Howard Wirtz will be the construction superintendent, Mrs. Lindsay, camp committee chairman said recently.

A tour of inspection of camp facilities made earlier in March by members of the committee revealed the need of considerable repairs to foundations, replacement of plumbing, and remodeling and repairing of the kitchen unit.

A call has been issued for volunteer labor on four weekends in April and May starting with Saturday and Sunday, April 9 and 10. Other work weekends will be April 23 and 24, April 30 and May 1, and May 7 and 8.

Volunteers will be asked to bring bedding and table service and to call the county extension office at the courthouse for a list of tools needed. Men will assist in construction and repair work and women will conduct a general camp clean-up and do the camp chores and cooking.

A policy of share-expense will be followed on the meals with supplies being purchased by the extension office for each work weekend. Campfire programs are planned for evening recreation.

"We estimate that \$1000 will have to be raised this spring to put the camp in condition for summer use," Mrs. Lindsay said.

It was announced recently by Headquarters 314th Air Division that S/Sgt. Delbert B. Campbell, son of Mrs. Mary A. Campbell, of Cave Junction, received a written commendation from Col. Stanley Stewart, Chief of Air Division Communications, for originating the Information Center Equipment Technicians Course at the Air Defense school. Campbell, who has just returned to the States, has been an integral part of a command which directs the operation of almost every type of aircraft known in the Air Forces in the performance of its mission as a Far East outpost.

As a public information specialist and communications instructor for 620th AC & W he wrote newspaper releases on members of his outfit and taught radio mechanics and wire communication in the course he originated.

Tree Planting On Page Creek District

A tree planting project involving planting of 50,000 Douglas-Fir seedlings was initiated on the Page Creek District of the Siskiyou National Forest Monday, April 4th of this week. The transplants are two and three years old and were grown at the Forest Service Wind River Nursery near Carson, Washington. These trees are being planted on about 80 acres of land cut-over through recent timber sale operations. While sufficient trees were left on the area to provide seed, planting is being done in an attempt to get young trees started before the brush has a chance to grow and retard restocking.

The project is financed by a portion of the receipts from the stumpage which was cut from the area, a procedure made possible thru legislation. There are eight men employed on the job and it is estimated they will complete the project in about 10 days.

District Ranger Harold Bowerman of Cave Junction is personally supervising the work.

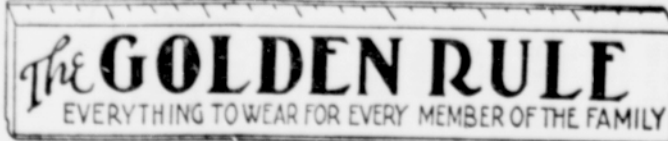
