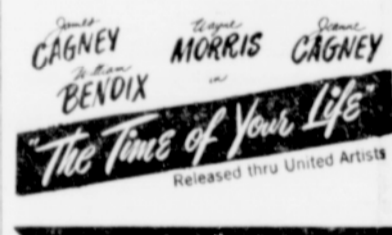

## Cave Junction To Decide Name

(From the Grants Pass Courier)  
On Wednesday, May 11, residents of Cave Junction hope to settle once and for all time the argument which has flared up repeatedly over the city's name, Mayor Elwood Hussey said here today (Wednesday).

A special election has been called for that date, at which a proposal to change the name to "Cave City" will be submitted.

At a Cave Junction chamber of commerce meeting Monday, sentiment for the change was almost unanimous, Hussey said.

Should a change of name be voted, the next step would be a petition to the postoffice department asking change of the post-office to conform, the mayor stated.

EDITOR'S NOTE—Now we know when the election is going to be held. We have been trying to get a definite answer to this question for some time, but were unable to get a definite answer.

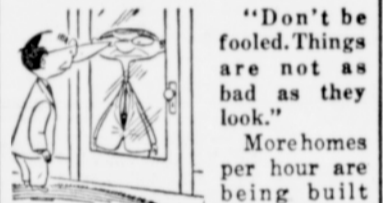
