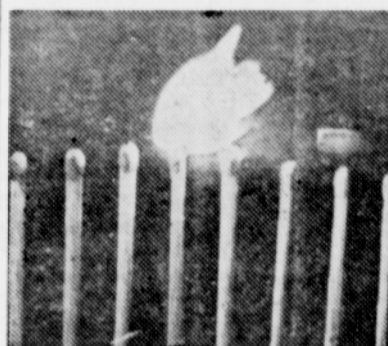

Predators 'Competitors'

The "Monthly News Flashes" of the Maryland game and inland fish commission, recommends some new definitions for predators and suggests that they be called "competitors" instead. They are:

Hard to "Match"



Here is a real test of marksmanship and accuracy—lighting a match with a bullet. Technicians at Western Cartridge Company photographed the performance of this feat with a series of unusual pictures, each made at three-millionths of a second exposure. A Model 52 heavy barrel target rifle and 22 caliber super match long rifle ammunition were used. The trick was to scrape the tip of the highest match. The other matches were added to make the trick more difficult.

Record Brownie

Official confirmation of a new world's record for an Alaskan Brown Bear has been given to Bob Reeve of Anchorage, Alaska, for a giant Brownie he killed on May 26, 1948, near Cold Bay. Weighing 1,800 pounds, with a pelt 12 feet 4 inches in width and 10 feet 4 inches in length, the Brownie was killed with a Model 95 Winchester lever action in 405 caliber. Reeve took two shots at approximately 270 yards with 300-grain soft point bullets to bring down his record breaker. Reeve's first shot broke the animal's left hip and his second penetrated both shoulders and killed the bear instantly.

Woody Helped



Walter Lantz, creator and producer of the famous Woody Woodpecker and other cartoons, displays three steelhead weighing from 8½ to 10 pounds which were caught on the Rogue river near Grants Pass, Oregon. The entire catch was made on a No. 1½ Russelure on a flyrod. As evidenced in the photo, Lantz seems to have received some help from Woody Woodpecker.

Elusive 'Minnie'

Fishermen around Jamestown, N. Y., are beginning to despair of ever capturing "Minnie Methuselah." That's the name of a muskellunge residing in Chautauqua Lake which measures 42 inches long. "Minnie" was last netted by state conservation officers in 1945, which was when they learned her dimensions. She was first netted in 1930 and a price was put on her head. She is tagged with the number "230." Prizes offered by merchants for "Minnie" still stand.
