BRAND RE-CORDING NOT DUE UNTIL JANUARY

Re-recording of 15,000 or more Oregon livestock brands will not be started until January, 1950, announces M. E. Knickerbocker, chief of the division of animal industry, state department of agriculture.

He said some brand owners are already sending in requests to retain their brands, but asks livestock owners to wait until January when official forms for re-recording of brands are mailed. At that time every current owner of a brand will receive, at the last address of record, notification of renewal, an official brand recording application blank and blotter for impression of the branding iron, together with a digest of the brand law as amended by the last legislature.

Under the amendments, the re-cording fee was increased to \$5 and the re-recording period changed from every 10 years to every five.
