"If new home costs would burden you—just wait till you get your bill for public housing."

Public housers in the Federal Government are asking Congress for the right to spend over 17 billion dollars and construct one million, fifty thousand public housing units in the next 3 1/2 years. At this rate each public housing unit will cost you, the American citizen, approximately \$17,000. None of this money will be repaid and it does not include cost of land, architects, and other fees.

This public housing will cost more than Americans paid to buy the over two million, two hundred thousand homes constructed by the private building industry during the last 3 1/2 years. The average sales price of homes produced by private industry was about \$3,000, or less than half the amount being spent to produce each public housing unit.

National Forest Timber For Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the Regional Forester or his authorized representative at the Office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p. m., October 24, 1949, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 149 acres within Sections 5 and 6, T. 41 S., R. 7 W., W. M., Elder Creek drainage of the East Fork Illinois River watershed, Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 6,269,800 feet B. M., of Douglas-fir, 645,000 feet B. M., more or less, of Port Orford cedar, and 388,800 feet B. M., more or less, of white fir and other species of sawtimber. Sealed bids accompanied by the required payment received by the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 p. m., October 24, 1949, will be considered the equivalent of an oral bid and posted for the information of all bidders. The appraised value of the timber according to long-term, normal market and operating conditions is \$2.05 per M feet for Douglas-fir; \$7.45 per M feet for Port Orford cedar, and \$0.50 per M feet for white fir and other species of sawtimber. No bid will be considered which is less than these rates as a base rate applicable through the entire period of the sale agreement, plus at least \$2.95 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$6.20 per M feet for Port Orford cedar, and \$0.50 per M feet for white fir and other species of sawtimber, the total to apply for all timber cut prior to November 30, 1950. On that date and at other times, as stated in the contract, total rates will be redetermined, but in no event will the redetermined stumpage rates be less than the basic appraised value as first above stated, and in no event will rates below those bid be established until at least 4,000,000 feet B. M. have been cut and paid for at not less than the bid rates. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.25 per M feet B. M., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.30 per M feet B. M., to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. \$5,000.00 to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages according to the conditions of sale, must accompany each sealed bid and must be shown to be in the possession of auction bidding. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately make the required payment and confirm the bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon.

Specialist Gives Pointers On Wrapping Frozen Meats

In records kept in the meats laboratory at Kansas state college on wrapping sides of beef, heavy aluminum foil proved to be the least expensive wrapping, costing 60 to 65 cents to wrap 100 pounds of meat, reports Miss Mary G. Fletcher, extension foods and nutritional specialist, Kansas State college, Manhattan.

Laminated papers cost on an average of 80 to 85 cents per 100 pounds, and other commercial wraps as high as 90 cents to \$1 per 100 pounds. Cellophane was not used because it has to be protected by a second wrap.

The meats laboratory, under the direction of D. L. Mackintosh, recently completed some research on frozen pork and pork sausage. One important conclusion from the study is that sausage should be seasoned to taste before it is frozen.

Sausage wrapped in laminated paper, cellophane, or aluminum will keep nine to 10 months. Miss Fletcher informs. That without seasoning will break down within three months. Pork wrapped in wax paper should be used within six months. Dr. Mackintosh emphasizes the importance of wrapping meat so that there is maximum contact between meat and wrapper—to exclude air.

The importance of uniform temperatures in the storage unit cannot be overemphasized. It is impossible to maintain uniform temperatures if unfrozen food is going into the unit. It has been said that one pound of unfrozen food per cubic foot of storage space can be placed in the unit without influencing the temperature too much.
