NOTICE OF REFERENDUM

On Creation of Proposed Illinois Valley Soil Conservation District, Embracing Lands Lying in the County of Josephine, in the State of Oregon, and the Election of three (3) District Supervisors.

To all owners of lands lying within the proposed Illinois Valley Soil Conservation District, comprising the territory described as follows:

Beginning at the N. W. corner of the N. E. 1/4 of section 13, T. 34 S., R. 10 W., W. M., said point being on the West county line of Josephine County; thence in a southerly direction following the county line between Josephine and Curry Counties to the Southwest corner of Josephine County; thence East along the South boundary line of Josephine County approximately 24 1/2 miles to the S. E. corner of section 13, T. 41 S., R. 6 W., W. M.; thence following section lines as follows: North approximately 7 miles to the S. E. corner of section 12, T. 40 S., R. 6 W., W. M.; then ce East 1 mile, North 1 mile, East 1 mile, North 1 mile to the N. E. corner of section 5, T. 40 S., R. 5 W., W. M.; thence West 3 miles, North 4 miles, West 2 miles, North 8 miles, West 3 miles to the S. E. corner of T. 37, R. 7 W., W. M.; thence North 2 miles, West 8 miles, North 9 miles to the N. E. corner of section 10, T. 36 S., R. 8 W., W. M.; thence West 2 miles, North 2 miles, West 2 miles, North 5 miles to the N. E. corner of T. 35 S., R. 9 W., W. M.; thence West 3 miles, North 4 miles, West approximately 3 1/2 miles to the point of beginning. All land lying within Josephine County, Oregon.

Notice is hereby given that on the 25th day of October, 1949, between the hours of 3:00 p. m. and 8:00 p. m. a referendum will be held in the said territory upon the proposition of the creation of the Illinois Valley Soil Conservation District as a governmental subdivision and a public body, corporate and politic, and in conjunction with said referendum, three (3) district supervisors will be elected under the provisions of the Soil Conservation Districts law of this State, Chapter 3, Title 109, O. C. L. A., as amended by Chapter 348, Oregon Laws, 1945.

Every person, firm and corporation, state, county, or municipal agency being the recorded owner of, or holding under contract of purchase, more than ten acres of lands lying within the said territory, is eligible to vote, and only such are eligible to vote.

Voting divisions and polling places for the referendum are as follows:

Division No. 1—Polling place located at Selma School.

Division No. 2—Polling place located at Cave Junction in the Legion Hall.

Eligible voters who will be absent from their division on the day of the referendum may apply in person or in writing to Ray Nickerson, Polling Superintendent, at Cave Junction, Oregon, for absentee ballots.
