Calcium for the Family
Take care to include an adequate amount of milk in the diet of your family to insure them of having a sufficient supply of calcium to maintain strong teeth, bones and healthy bodies. "Eyes" For the Blind
The blind and near-blind may soon be able to read without the aid of Braille, which has been mastered by only about one-fifth of the nation's 250,000 sightless persons, the Better Vision institute recently reported. Three new reading aids have been developed, one depending on the sense of sound, one on touch, and one on vision—the latter for the partly-blind.

'Turkish Tobaccos' Grown Successfully in America
"Turkish tobaccos" now being grown for the first time in the United States taste better and contain less nicotine than costly imports, Dr. Frederick R. Darkis of Duke university reported to the American Chemical society.

Recent tests have disproved the long-standing theory that the United States could not produce these exotic tobaccos, which are used mainly in blended cigarettes and have been imported at the rate of more than 40,000,000 pounds a year for the past thirty years, he said.

In 1948 they were profitably grown in small volume by several hundred farmers. An organization has been established to purchase these tobaccos from the growers and prepare them for use by the tobacco industry, which is interested in obtaining them.

Successful results have been achieved in recent experimental work carried out by Duke university in cooperation with the agricultural experiment stations of North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia.

The speaker, who explained that "Turkish tobaccos" are so called after the region of their origin, said they are scientifically known as tobaccos of the "aromatic type," and are characterized by the smallness of their leaf and their large volume of aroma.
