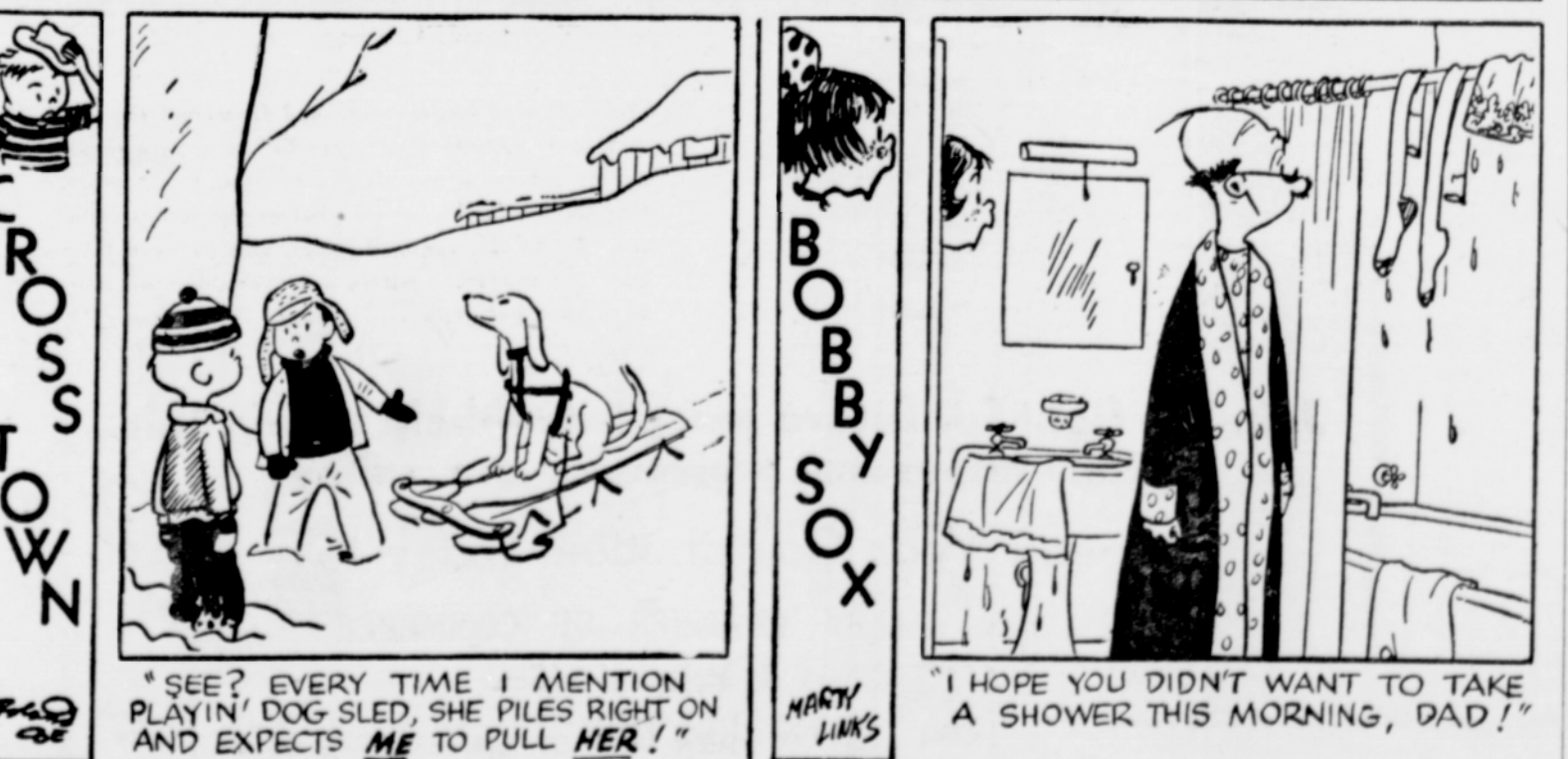

To the Rescue

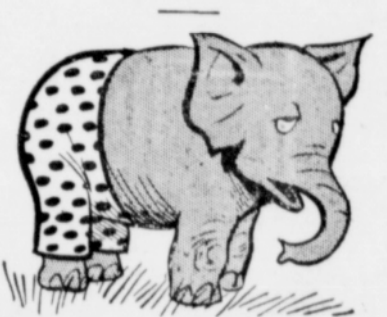
A widow owned and occupied a large mansion practically in the heart of a southern town. During the housing shortage in wartime, the aged man who worked for her overheard a passerby say:
