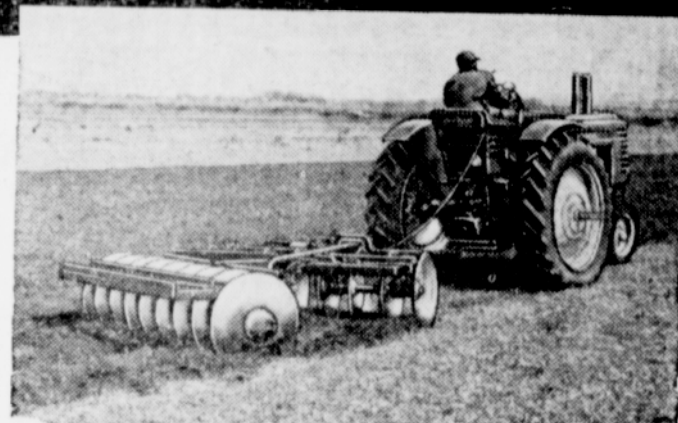
The judge had just awarded a divorce to a wife who had charged non-support.
