Running through "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine" is the tender romance between Fred MacMurray and Sylvia Sidney backgrounded by the deadly feud between the Tollivers and the Falins in the wild Cumberland Mountain region. MacMurray plays an engineer from the outside world who tries to bring the idea of modern progress into the lives of the primitive mountain clans. Miss Sidney is a wild mountain girl who is pledged to marry her cousin, Henry Fonda. The two men's rivalry for Sylvia accounts for some of the violent action the film boasts, the balance stemming from the clash of the clans. "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine" is a faithful adaptation of the John Fox, Jr., famous classic. Others co-starred are Fred Stone and Beulah Bondi.

SUNDAY and MONDAY

Acclaimed as one of the greatest outdoor films ever made, Argosy Pictures' production of "She Wore a Yellow Ribbon" co-stars John Wayne, Joanne Dru, John Agar, Ben Johnson and Harry Carey, Jr., in a thrilling story of the U.S. cavalry. The movie, in color by Technicolor, tells of a crucial period in the turbulent history of the west.

With the defeat of General Custer on the Little Big Horn on June 25, 1876, Indian tribes throughout the west plan to join in a great alliance to drive the hated white man from their lands. And at Fort Starke, far out in the Indian country, the most experienced Indian fighter of them all, Captain Nathan Brittles, faces compulsory retirement from the service just when he is most needed.

Around this dramatic situation hinges the tense action of the film. The fort's commander sends Brittles with his troop to take the two ladies at the post to safety, but the Cheyennes have already gone on the warpath and wiped out the stage station.

Interwoven with the plot is a romantic triangle involving Miss Dru and Brittles' two young lieutenants, Agar and Carey, while the fifth star, Johnson, portrays a smart young sergeant.

TUESDAY and WEDNESDAY

Two exciting films will be offered movie fans on this double bill. Out of James Oliver Curwood's most exciting pages, Columbia Pictures has made a thrilling outdoor tale of Kazan, snarling king of the frozen wilds. The other feature is "Daughter of the West," taken from the novel of that name by Robert E. Callahan who acted also as associate producer and technical advisor on the film.

"Kazan" is a gripping adventure story set against the magnificent and snow-locked wilderness of the Canadian north woods. From Curwood's novel, Arthur A. Ross has written a screen-play replete with stirring outdoor action as raging beasts square off in combat without quarter and maddened men settle their disputes with the time-honored law of the fist. Thomas Weyman (Stephen Dunne), a game conservation agent, attempts to win over Kazan with kindness, but fails.

Excitement, spectacle and colorful action run rampant through Film Classic's "Daughter of the West." The movie, a Cinecolor adventure of life among the Navajos, stars Martha Vickers, Philip Reed and Donald Woods.

The film tells of a girl who goes to the Navajo reservation, falls in love with an Indian lad, and becomes innocently involved in the intrigue against the Indians. Included in the footage are Indian dances never before filmed, as well as the ritual of the trial by fire, in which the Indian youth, accused of murder, proves his innocence under tribal law by walking through the fire pit.

THURSDAY and FRIDAY

Adventure on a rugged and suspenseful scale is promised fans with the presentation of Paramount's "Rope of Sand." It is Hal Wallis' newest production which co-stars Burt Lancaster, Paul Henreid, Claude Rains and Peter Lorre. Making her first introduction to American audiences is the luscious Parisienne, Corinne Calvet. The distinguished character actor Sam Jaffe has the top featured role.

"Rope of Sand" is set in the fascinatingly interesting diamond country of South Africa. The story concerns the determined efforts of Lancaster, former hunting guide, to recover a cache of stolen diamonds, hidden in the forbidden area of the diamond city. Henreid, who will be seen as the viciously cruel supervisor of the city, not only wants to get those jewels, but wants to get Lancaster, as well. Sworn enemies, the two men are additionally antagonistic because of their mutual attraction to Miss Calvet.

The intrigue set in motion by these conflicting forces and the rugged, fight-to-the-death action is said to pack this film with sensational, edge-of-the-seat thrills.

After a delicious steak dinner, the members disposed of the regular business of the meeting and a most interesting discussion was held on various prospective projects for Cave Junction and the Illinois Valley. It was voted that the Illinois Valley chamber become a member of the Chamber of Commerce Unit of the Redwood Empire association and that Mrs. Frank Rauber present our membership check in person when she attends the R.E.A. meeting in Santa Rosa next Thursday. It was arranged for several members of the chamber to attend the Highway Interim Committee meeting in Medford on Wednesday, April 12.

4-H Club Increase Activity in Home

Trend of the times—people are spending more leisure hours in the home. This is particularly true of rural folk. Many have recently electrified their homes, added telephones and modern farm machinery. Consequently farm families are giving more consideration to the comfort and beauty of their dwellings. Of particular value in this direction is the National 4-H Home Improvement program now in its fourth year. Enrollment has increased almost 15,000 in the past year, and the number of 4-H'ers awarded county medals jumped from 2,433 to 3,052.

In Oregon some 650 club members will take part in the 1950 program, according to the state extension office which conducts the activity. County extension agents and local club leaders give demonstrations, prepare displays and instruct the youth in phases of home improvement. Members who become skilled in some particular job such as upholstering, floor sanding or working with color also give demonstrations. The enthusiasm shown by their sons and daughters inspires parents to cooperate in carrying out long-range plans to make their homes more livable.

A favorite starting place for girls—and boys, too—has been their own bedrooms. They have

done amazing things with a little ingenuity, lots of hard work, a few cans of paint and bright new fabrics. Living rooms should be high on the list this year, because the family finds extra time together indoors. Club members who have been active in the program during the past few years are now skilled in renovating old furniture and redecorating the home. Many have done remarkable carpentry work, building closets, cupboards and bookshelves.

Outstanding accomplishments will again be rewarded by the Sears Roebuck Foundation. A \$300 college scholarship will be awarded to the eight top-ranking 4-H'ers in the nation. The state champion will be given a trip to the National 4-H Club Congress, and county winners a medal. Last year medals were presented to 7 in Oregon. State honors went to Roberta Harris of Summer Lake.

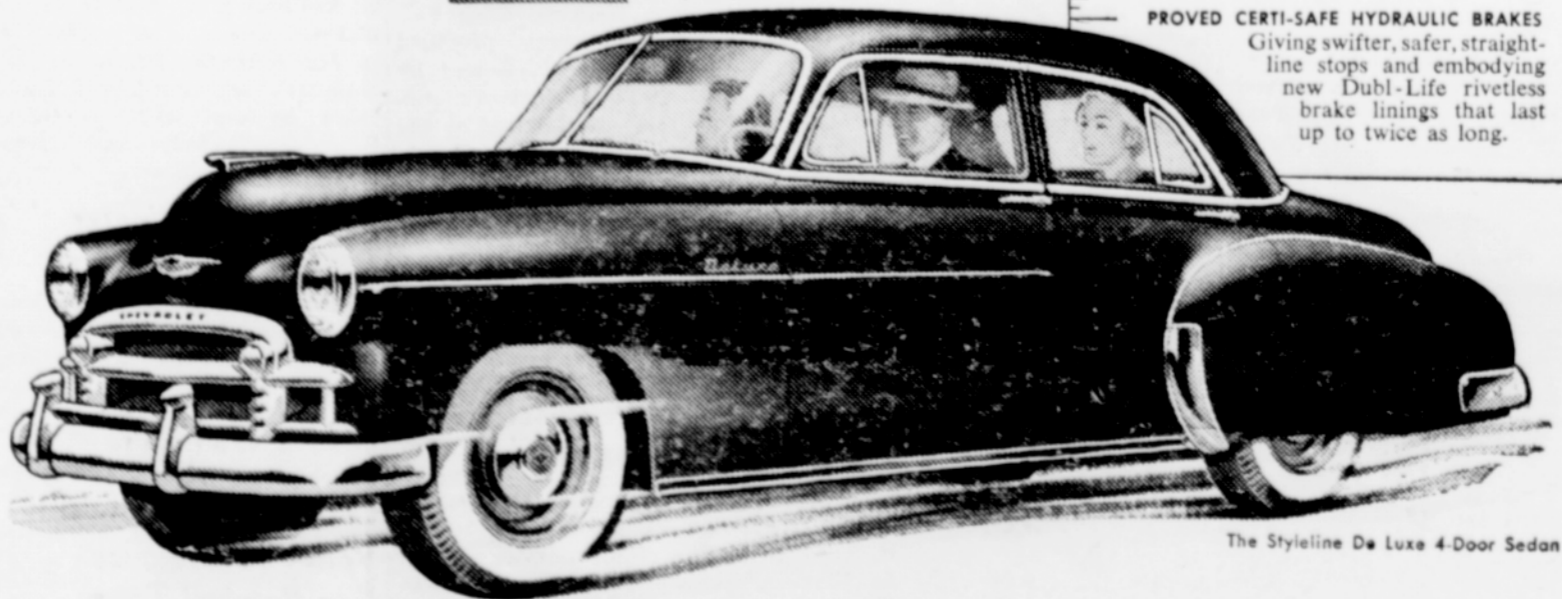
