Adventist churches throughout the world are taking part in this drive. According to word from the church's world headquarters in Washington, D. C., even natives in the jungles of the Amazon river are participating in the program. Canadian Adventists have found the campaign so successful they are adding a fourth day, September 2.

The churches Dorcas Welfare society is cooperating in the plan to give material as well as spiritual help to needy families located during the neighborhood visits.
