Proposing an amendment to the Charter of the City of Cave Junction, Josephine County, Oregon, to be known as Chapter XII of said Charter, authorizing the Common Council to issue General Obligation Bonds in a sum not in excess of Twenty Thousand (\$20,000.00) Dollars, as hereinafter described, for the purpose of providing funds for funding the existing indebtedness of the Water Department, to retire all special obligation notes of said department, and to extend and improve the water system; the expenditure of said funds to be in the discretion of the Mayor and Common Council; providing that said proposed Charter amendment be submitted to the electors of said City for their approval or rejection at a special election to be held in said City on the 27th day of June, 1950; appointing Judges and Clerks of election; providing a ballot title for said proposed amendment; providing for notice of election; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAVE JUNCTION

Section I That an amendment to the Charter of the City of Cave Junction, Josephine County, Oregon, be and the same is hereby proposed and referred for submission to the legal voters of said City at a Special Election to be held on the 27th day of June, 1950, which Charter Amendment, to be so referred, is as follows:

Section 3 That as regards the holding of said election, it shall in all particulars, be conducted in conformity with Chapter VI of the Charter of the City of Cave Junction.

Section 4 That inasmuch as it is imperative that the issuance and sale of bonds for the purpose herein mentioned should be accomplished at once, to provide better water distribution within the City, and to take advantage of prevailing low interest rates on municipal bonds, it is deemed necessary for the peace, health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Cave Junction, that an emergency be and the same is hereby declared to exist, and the Resolution shall in full force and effect from and after its adoption by the Council, and approval by the Mayor.

Section 5 The foregoing Resolution was introduced, read twice, once in full and once by title, and put on its final adoption at a meeting of the Common Council held on the 12th day of June, 1950, by a unanimous vote as follows:

Section 51. That it shall be the duty of the Common Council to attend to the proper application of the funds derived from the sale of said bonds, and the purchaser, or purchasers thereof shall, in no event, be responsible or charged with the proper application of the funds derived from the sale thereof."

Section 2. That Amy Hussey and Margaret Crawl and Ruth Palmer are hereby appointed as judge and clerks of said election; that the American Legion Hall is hereby designated as the voting place for said election. Polls will be open from eight o'clock in the forenoon to eight o'clock in the afternoon on the date herein fixed for said election.

Section 3. That the ballot title under which said proposed Charter amendment shall be submitted, and as the same shall appear on the ballot at the said special election to be held on June 27th, 1950, shall be as follows:

PURPOSE: To amend the Charter of the City of Cave Junction, Josephine County, Oregon, by adding thereto Chapter XII, to authorize the issuance of General Obligation Bonds of said City in an amount not to exceed the sum of \$20,000.00; to bear interest at a rate to be determined by the Common Council; to be serial in character and callable after five years from the date thereof; to be retired in not to exceed twenty years; the funds realized from the sale thereof to be used for the purpose of funding the existing indebtedness of the water department, to retire all special obligation notes of said department, and to extend and improve the water system.
