HOT ROD-ITY FEVER SPRING FANCY BY CRAVATH
ATTLESEY-TROJANS' "ACE" STANFIELD OF SETON HALL

Why it is that kids roll as they do in hotrods, and have aspirations as auto race drivers, may be explained in part by the rewards going to pilots like Johnny Parsons, of Van Nuys, Calif., the 1950 Indianapolis winner in a race cut from 500 to 345 miles because of a sudden shower.
