CHICKEN PIQUANT

- 2 large slices salt pork
- 2 minced onions
- 1 five-pound fowl
- Flour
- Salt
- 2 minced sweet peppers
- 1 pint canned tomatoes
- 2 cloves
- 1 teaspoonful salt
- Boiling water
- 1/4 teaspoonful pepper

Put the salt pork through the meat-chopper and saute in a hot skillet until the fat is tried out and bits of pork are dry and brown. Skim out the pork and fry the minced onions in the fat until a light brown. Then remove the onions. Joint the fowl, dredge with flour and salt, and brown in the fat, turning frequently. Then put back the pork scraps and onions, add the sweet peppers minced, canned tomatoes, cloves, salt, pepper, and enough boiling water just to cover the chicken. Cover and let simmer one hour, stirring carefully that it may not stick. Then bake in a 400°F. oven for two hours or until very tender. Uncover the last half-hour of the time, that the sauce may become thick and rich. When ready to serve, remove the chicken and thicken the sauce slightly if it needs it. Pour around the chicken and garnish with parsley, tiny biscuits, or cooked potato balls. Serves six to eight.

TURKEY COUNTRY STYLE

- Turkey meat
- 1 carrot, quartered
- 2 medium-sized peeled potatoes
- 12 small white onions
- 2 quarts water
- Left-over gravy and stuffing
- 2 tablespoonfuls flour
- 2 tablespoonfuls fat
- 1/2 teaspoonful salt
- 1/2 teaspoonful celery salt
- 1/2 teaspoonful pepper
- Speck cayenne
- 1 teaspoonful chopped parsley and celery

Trim off all the meat left from the

turkey, leaving in as large pieces as possible. Put the bone and skin in a saucepan, add the carrot cut in quarters, peeled potatoes, and onions. Add the water, the left-over stuffing and gravy, and cook well covered for about an hour. Strain the broth off, leaving the vegetables. Thicken the broth with the flour and fat rubbed together. When the thickened broth comes to a boil, add the onions, the turkey, and the potatoes cut in small pieces. Season with salt, celery salt, pepper, and cayenne and pour into a deep dish. Add the chopped parsley and celery and serve. This dish will use the last of the turkey and will make a luncheon or supper main dish.

TURKEY BOMBAY

- 1 tablespoonful fat
- 1 minced green pepper
- Minced hearts two white onions
- 1/2 chopped apple
- 1 cupful raw washed rice
- 2 cupfuls diced turkey meat
- 2 cupfuls consommé
- 1/2 cupful strained tomato juice
- 1 teaspoonful salt
- 1/2 teaspoonful pepper
- 2 beaten egg-yolks
- 2 tablespoonfuls grated Parmesan cheese

Cut the meat from the turkey in one-half-inch pieces. Heat the fat, add the minced green pepper and the minced hearts of the two white onions, brown a few minutes, and add one-half chopped apple, the rice, consommé, strained tomato juice, salt and pepper. Then add the turkey, mix well, put in a covered casserole in a 400°F. oven, and bake for forty-five minutes. Remove and add to the hot mixture the beaten egg-yolks and grated Parmesan cheese. Mix lightly, put all in a greased mold, and steam for twenty-five minutes. Unmold and serve hot with reheated gravy. Serves four to six.

SAUSAGE CASSEROLE

- 1 lb. of bulk sausage
- 1 cup of uncooked rice
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1 small can mushrooms and

liquid
2 cans (10 1/2 oz) chicken with rice soup
Brown sausage and cook out all fat and pour off; combine with remaining ingredients in a 2 qt. greased casserole. Bake at 325 or moderate oven 1 1/2 hours.

Highway Commission Will Entertain Bids July 10 - 11

The State Highway Commission is calling for bids at its meeting in Portland July 10th and 11th, on 32 projects, located in 22 counties of the state, and which in the aggregate represent an estimated total expenditure of \$2,200,000.

Included in the list are 2 bridges, 3 buildings, 2 rock production jobs and 25 road construction projects. The road work involves 32 miles of grading; 43-57 miles of rock base or surfacing; 87 miles of oiling work and 24.27 miles of asphaltic concrete paving.
