U.S. National Bank Again Shows Gains On Report

The United States National Bank of Portland again leads the state in total deposits, as shown by its mid-year report.

Deposits now aggregate \$523,856,788, a gain of \$18,265,189 during the past year. Deposits for the Grants Pass Branch stand at \$7,493,665, according to Robt. Neilson, Jr., manager.

Loans and discounts for the United States National have also shown a healthy increase since last June 30, now totalling \$151,643,346. This represents a gain of \$18,809,095 in the last 12-month period.

According to Mr. Neilson, the Grants Pass Branch reports a loans and discounts total of \$2,982,206.
