PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNERS

This office has just completed the issuing of warrants for the collection of delinquent personal property taxes. Serving of these warrants will start not later than August 1st.

Within five days after warrant has been served judgment will be taken against the delinquent tax payer.

Said warrants will be served only on those taxpayers who have real property appearing on the tax rolls in their name.

When no real property is involved and personal property is thus unsecured collection will be made under a different Statute, which requires that we levy upon the assessed personal property, take same into our possession and shall immediately advertise such goods and chattels for sale by posting printed notices of the time and place of sale in three public places in the county, not less than ten days prior to such sale, and if payment be not paid before the time appointed, the tax collector shall proceed to sell such property at public venue.
