QUICK CHICKEN STEW

2 cups cold potato
1 cupful bits or diced chicken
1/2 teaspoonful salt
1/2 teaspoonful paprika
2 cups thickened chicken
gravy
2 cups boiling water
1 onion minced fine
1 tablespoonful parsley
Dice the cold potato, and add the
chicken, salt and paprika. Meanwhile,
dilute the chicken gravy with the
boiling water, add the onion, minced
fine, and simmer until the onion is
tender. Then add to the chicken, heat
thoroughly, and serve, sprinkling with
the parsley just before serving. Peas,
carrots, or a few cooked string-
beans may be added to the stew. Or
dumplings may be made and arranged
around the edge of the platter, if
desired.

SAVORY CHICKEN

1 six-pound chicken or fowl
1 dozen small onions
3 stalks celery
2 medium-sized carrots
1 teaspoonful salt
3 cupfuls strained tomatoes
1 tablespoonful butter
Select a six-pound chicken or fowl,
cut into neat pieces. Dredge with well-
seasoned flour and sauté in fat or
drippings until well browned on both
sides. Lay in a deep casserole and
place around it the onions which have
been peeled, celery cut into inch pieces,
and carrots sliced. Sprinkle all with
the salt and then pour the strained
tomatoes over the top. Dot the surface
with the butter, cover lightly, and cook
in a 350°F. oven until the chicken
and vegetables are tender, the time
required being from two and one-half
to three hours. Serve with cooked
rice. Serves six to eight.

1 large tender cooked fowl
(5 pounds)
2 1/2 cupfuls cooked diced potatoes
1 1/2 cupfuls small cooked onions
1 1/2 cupfuls cooked carrots
1 cupful small canned peas

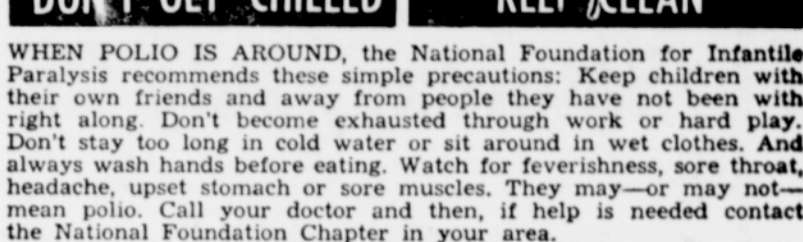

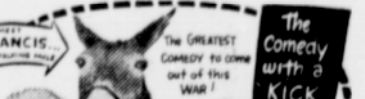
