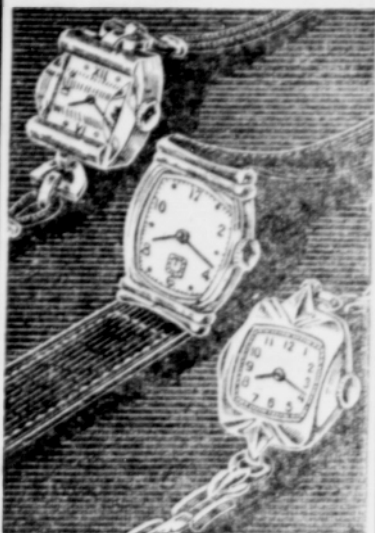

such as the "King's Palace," which with the colored lighting on looks like all the beautiful jewels Kings might own. Other rooms include "The Chapel," "Paradise Lost" etc. A stalagmite of hugs dimensions is called the Washington Monument.

A small mountain river flows through the cavern and is named the River Styx. There is constant dripping of water there with accompanying moisture. Is one so desirous he may rent galoshes and waterproof coveralls to cover his clothes, but this is quite unnecessary as there is not enough moisture to cause any discomfort.

These Oregon Caves within a mountain of marble are a sight that all Oregon visitors should not fail to see. Approximately two miles is covered under ground and it takes about an hour for the trip. The highest room is 300 feet above the point of entrance.

On your way north you can't afford to miss seeing these amazing underground caverns, the Oregon Caves.
