Final Hunting Laws

Approved For Oregon

The Oregon State Game com-
mission met Saturday, July 29,
after a public hearing, and adopt-
ed the final hunting regulations
for 1950. Very few changes were
made and the final hunting regula-
tions are nearly the same as the
tentative regulations released sev-
eral weeks ago.

A major change was the moving
forward of the October 1 deer sea-
son opening to September 30. This
will allow a Saturday opening and
three full week-ends of hunting
during the general deer season.

Several areas listed for the two-
day hunter's choice deer season
were changed. The high desert
section east of Bend was elimin-
ated from this season. In addition,
all of Hood River county outside
the exterior boundaries of the Mt.
Hood National forest was opened
for the hunter's choice season.

In western Oregon, the hunter's
choice open area for deer will in-
clude all current established culti-
vated agricultural lands and ad-
jacent non-cultivated lands within
a radius of one mile of these agri-
cultural lands. However, all of
Tillamook county and lands within
the exterior boundaries of national
forests will not be included in
the hunter's choice deer season.

An additional area was opened
to archery hunting. This sets a
season for archers from September
16 to September 28 in the Cow
Creek Refuge in Douglas county.

Two changes in bag limits were
also made. The first raised the bag
on valley quail to ten a day and
twenty a season. The other set the
bag limit on band-tailed pigeons,
if allowed by Federal regulations,
at eight a day and twenty-four a
season.

Sherman and Wasco counties
were removed from the areas open
to hunting for Hungarian part-
ridge. The moving of the trapping
season opening in Malheur county
from November 15 to November 1
completed the changes.

The 1950 hunting regulations in
printed form will be available at
all Game commission license agen-
cies by the first week of Septem-
ber.

Trout 'Air-Lift' Stocks

Oregon's Mountain Lakes

A trout air-lift operation has
stocked inaccessible lakes along
the Cascade Skyline with 3,000,000
fingerling trout this summer, ac-
cording to Reino O. Koski, Oregon
State Game commission fishery
agent, who headed the operation.

The aerial fish planting mission
made releases of rainbow and
brook trout over 251 Cascade
lakes ranging from Hood River to
Klamath county. Landing strips
for the trout air-lift were located
at Hood River, Sisters, Fall River
fish hatchery near Bend, and
Klamath Agency.

The trout were hauled from the
fish hatcheries to the landing
strips in ten-gallon milk cans.
Compressed air was bubbled
through the milk cans by means of
a manifold hose set-up. This pro-
cedure eliminated danger of trout
loss through delay in transfer
to the plane. The fish were then
poured through a funnel into the
planes twin belly tanks which held
trout enough for two average-
sized lakes. The drops were made
at altitudes ranging from 100 to
300 feet.

The plane, a Piper Clipper, was
piloted by Sam Whitney of New-
burg. The terrain covered in some
of the trickiest in the West, and
the flying was done in the early
morning hours to avoid turbulent
air currents.

This was Whitney's third year
of fish flying for the Game Com-
mission, and the operation was the
largest yet conducted. Formerly,
pack animals were employed. How-
ever, the mule has not been entire-
ly replaced for packing some of
the smaller lakes, and even the
back-packing method is being em-
ployed in cooperation with sports-
men's groups.

Koski urges that anglers visit-
ing the back-country lakes, report
on the success of the trout plant-
ings and the condition of the fish.
Observations made to date by
Game commission personnel, in-
dicate good survival of the plane
planted fish in all but one instance.
