GOVERNOR'S PRESS RELEASE

A campaign of truth must be brought to communists all over the world if modern civilization is to avert another great war, Governor Douglas McKay warned Saturday in setting aside the period from September 4 through October 16 for observance by and for the Crusade for freedom in Oregon. Governor McKay is honorary state chairman of the Crusade for Freedom.

"Under tested leadership," said the governor, "it is a counter-movement designed to arouse in the mind and heart of each American the true appreciation of the struggle we face; seeking to make the moral determination of each of us apparent to the world and the gangsters of international communism; carrying the truth of American friendship and of Russian ruthlessness to the unfortunate millions constantly exposed to communist lies."

COMMON SENSE AT PAR

"There ain't no X."

Just samples, these, of carli-witchers and questions David O'Hara of the state department of elections has to clear when befuddled judges and clerks phone from voting precincts during late ballot counting hours.

To keep his slumbers peaceful and to avoid ulcers he has issued some common sense instructions. "Consider the intent of the voter," he admonishes, "as votes must be counted even if an X is not made or if the name of the candidate is mis-spelled."

STATE BALLOT READY

Certification has been made by the department of elections of Oregon's general election ballot in

November. Copies were prepared to send to county clerks early this week. Withdrawal of Joe E. Dunne as an independent candidate for governor narrowed the race down to Austin Flegel (D) and Douglas McKay (R).

Three are in the race for U. S. senate—Wayne Morse (R), Howard Latourette (D) and Harlin Talbot (Prog). For congress in 1st Dist., Walter Norblad (R) is opposed by Hoy Hewitt (D); in the 2nd, Lowell Stockman (R) is opposed by Vernon Bull (D); three are opposing Homer D. Angell (R), Carl C. Donagh (D), V. S. Alberson (Prog) and A. W. Lafferty (Ind); in the 4th Harris Ellsworth (R) is opposed by D. C. Shaw (D). Rex Putnam, non-partisan, is unopposed for Supt. of Public Instruction. Labor Commissioner W. E. Kimsey (R) is opposed by Howard Morgan (D). Earl C. Latourette, Walter L. Tooze, Arthur D. Hay and Hall S. Lusk have no opposition for the supreme court bench. Carl Warner is being opposed by Allan Carson in a write-in race for justice of the supreme court to fill vacancy caused by the death of Harry H. Belt.

SCHOOL BUS LAWS

During the 1949-50 school year there was not a fatality in connection with the operation of 1,320 school buses in Oregon. There were two deaths the previous year; before the new school bus laws enacted by the 1949 legislature went into effect.

Only four school children were injured in school bus accidents in comparison with 15 the previous year. Captain Walter Lansing of the state police division who heads the state's safety program, keeps all school buses closely inspected, conducts driver training courses and enforces the provision in the new law which requires that all motorists shall come to a complete stop while school buses are loading or unloading passengers.

GUARD UNIT ALERTED

Governor McKay received an order from the secretary of the Army Friday alerting the 1810th Engineer Aviation company at the Portland air base to federal duty. The order includes bringing the company to full strength.

The governor conferred immediately with Maj. Gen. Thomas E. Rilea to comply with the order by the date, October 1, set by the Army.

CONVICTS UNIMPRESSIBLE
Evangelist Billy Graham told a crowd of 1200 stoical state prison convicts that by accepting Jesus Christ even a prison could be "a heaven and a paradise."

In his Wednesday talk to the impulsive inmates he said that "we're all sinners" and must face God twice—at death and at judgement. At death, he declared, souls go to Hell for rejecting Christ, not for breaking laws, and they go to Heaven for accepting Christ, not just for Bible reading and going to church.

NAVY SOUNDS CALL FOR RESERVE WAVES TO APPLY FOR DUTY

The Navy sounded a call last week to officer and enlisted women Naval Reserves to submit their applications for recall to active duty on a voluntary basis for an obligated period of one year.

Vacancies in the active duty ranks are open for WAVE Reserve officers in the grade of Lieutenant Commander and below, in Line and Staff Corps. Enlisted women in pay grades three through seven in general and emergency service ratings of Teleman, Radioman, Communications Technicians, Yeoman, Personnelman, Machine Accountant, Storekeeper, Disbursing Storekeeper, Aerographer, Training Devices Man, Aviation Storekeeper, Hospitalman and Dental Technicians, only, will be accepted.

Applicants must be physically qualified and must execute an official statement that they are not a parent or custodian of a child under 18 years of age.

Women officer applications may be submitted to the Bureau of Naval Personnel, Navy Department, Washington 25, D. C. A copy of the application to be sent to the Commandant of the 13th Naval District.

Enlisted women may submit their requests for active duty to the Commandant, Thirteenth Naval District, 1611 West Wheeler St., Seattle 99, Washington, or go to their nearest Navy Recruiting Station.

WAVE Reserves who were formally enlisted in V-10 and never reenlisted in V-10 may do so and be eligible to volunteer for active duty.

Applicants recalled to duty may be sent to any station to fill vacancies which exist in their ranks or rates.

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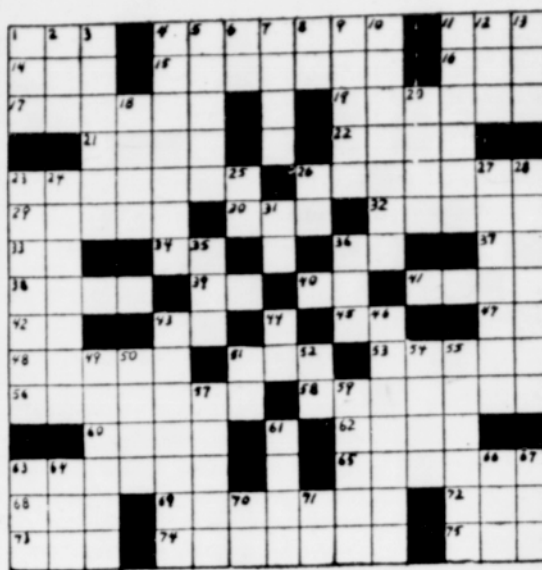
