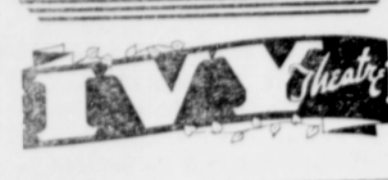

**REBEKAH LODGE GOLDEN JUBILEE**

Marguerite Rebekah Lodge No. 111 celebrated its Golden Jubilee on Wednesday, November 29. This was held in the Masonic hall at Kerby.

The affair started with a lovely ham dinner with all the trimmings. There were one hundred and fifty people served, twelve from Grants Pass and ten from Klamath Falls.

After everyone had enjoyed dinner, they adjourned to the lodge room where the Noble Grand of the lodge, Virginia Steimer, welcomed the visitors in a few appropriate words. The flag of our country was then presented while everyone sang a verse of our national anthem and then pledged allegiance to the flag.

Our guest of the evening, Sister Anna Whitrock, was then escorted to the center of the floor where she was presented with a lovely bouquet as her fifty year jewel had not arrived at this time. Brother Bill Decker was also presented with a boutonniere as he used to be a member of the Rebekah lodge. But he is still a member of the Oddfellows. They both gave lovely talks and thanked the lodge.

The past Noble Grands were presented to the center of the floor. There were twenty of them and then three little girls presented them with corsages and little gavelts. The girls, Lillian Steimer, Nita White and Rayne Thrasher were dressed in pink and green dresses made of crepe paper.

A reading was given by Effie Smith called the "History of the Lodge." On November 10, 1900, the Marguerite Rebekah lodge was organized under the direction of Sister Sarah Clevenger, assisted by Sisters Edith McGreger, Elsa Hartman and Lucile McCroskey of Etna Rebekah lodge of Grants Pass. There were seven sisters and nine brothers who began the work of Oddfellowship with a determination to carry on the cause that had been entrusted to them.

There were no key books at this time from which to learn the secret work. Sister Clevenger took the first Noble Grand, Anna Whitrock, to a hotel room where she was instructed in the same. In the evening the new officers conducted their first meeting.

The time of meetings was on Saturday afternoons the same day the subordinate lodge met. Not a very convenient time but that way the members could go in the daylight as some walked two and three miles.

The first few years of the work was sort of a struggle but all good work is, and we enjoyed the duties and smiled from then on.

In 1910 the membership was around forty. The first few years there were very few social activities. We just did not know how and going places in those days was not as easy as now.

As each period in the history of the lodge has passed by, there is always the faithful few to take up the work and carry on for those who have either grown negligent, passed away or given up the struggle.

In the past few years we have had our district conventions which are a great help to all of us. There are now one hundred and three members in our lodge and as the petals of the Marguerite drop one by one, so our faithful brothers and sisters have dropped from us and there are always the flowers springing up to take the place of the faded ones so the work of Rebekah Oddfellowship will continue on in friendship, love and truth.

The program closed with the showing of old-time pictures by Brother Isham of Grants Pass which were greatly enjoyed by all. What a change in the lives and living of years ago and now.
