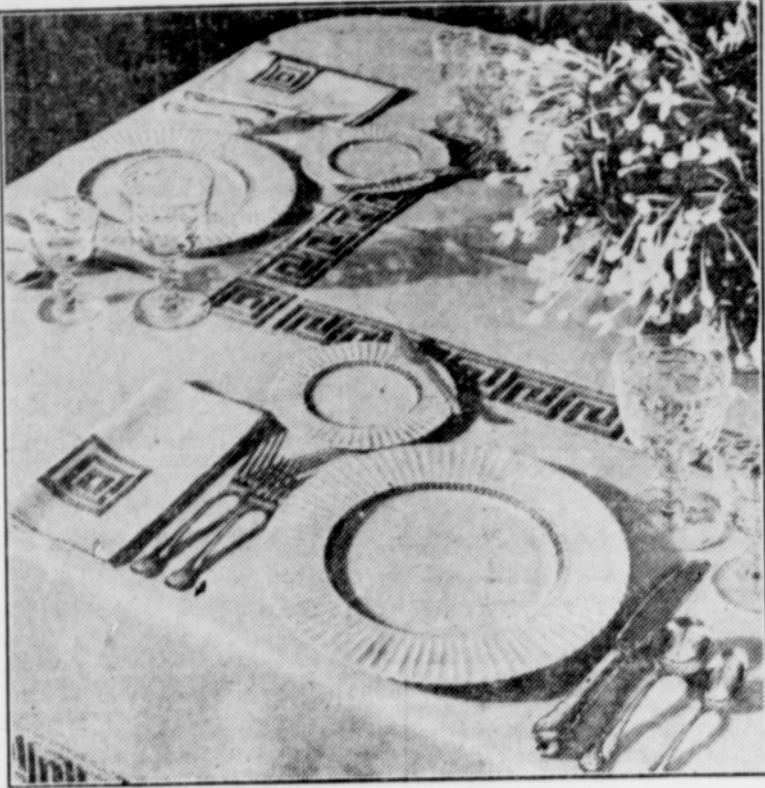


Team Your China With Table Linens

Such matched table appointments are especially effective in formal settings, and a clever hostess can use them to create a stunning table for her dinner party. Shown here is such a teamed table setting, where all the details combine to produce an effect of matched elegance. The formal grace of the fine china—"Cretan" by Lenox—is echoed in a Palmer-Smith cloth of Irish linen, its design specifically inspired by this particular china. The Greek motif embroidered in non-tarnishable metal thread on the cloth follows the 24-k. gold pattern of the creamy translucent plates.

ITALIAN EGG SALAD

- 4 hard-cooked eggs
- 1 cupful cooked dandelion greens
- 1 small cream or Neufchâtel cheese
- 1/2 teaspoonful salt
- 1/8 teaspoonful pepper
- 1/4 cupful well-seasoned French dressing
- 1/2 cupful mayonnaise
- Lettuce

Chop the eggs and green very fine, separately. Mix them together adding the cheese, salt, pepper and sufficient French dressing to make the right consistency to shape with the hands. Chill, form into balls, and lay on a bed of lettuce. Pour any remaining French dressing over them and garnish with mayonnaise. Serves four to six.

MIXED VEGETABLE AND EGG SALAD

- 1 cupful shredded string beans
- 1 cupful peas
- 1 cupful shredded cucumber
- French dressing
- Radish-roses
- 1/4 cupful sliced radishes
- Lettuce-heart
- 6 hard-cooked eggs
- Lemon jelly
- Parsley
- Mayonnaise

Mix together the peas and shredded string-beans, cooked, the shredded cucumber, and sliced radishes and let stand in a cold place for thirty minutes to marinate in French dressing. Halve the hard-cooked eggs lengthwise, cut off the lower ends so that they will stand upright, and dip each one in a little tart lemon jelly, which is very cold, but not yet set; have the salad plates very cold and arrange these egg-halves in a circle. They should stick at once if the jelly mixture contains enough gelatine. Fill in with the vegetable mixture, top with a let-

tuce heart, and garnish with parsley and radish-roses. Pass mayonnaise. Serves six to eight.

MOCK LOBSTER SALAD

- 2 cupfuls cold cooked halibut
- 1 cupful radishes shredded
- 1/2 teaspoonful salt
- 1/8 teaspoonful paprika
- 1/4 cupful mayonnaise

Flake the halibut. Shred radishes with the skins on, measuring one cupful. Mix with the halibut, add the salt and paprika. Mix lightly with mayonnaise and serve on crisp white lettuce. Serves six.

MOLDED CHICKEN AND CUCUMBER SALAD

- 3 cupfuls canned tomato
- 6 celery sticks
- 2 chopped onions
- 3 teaspoonfuls salt
- 1 teaspoonful sugar
- 1/4 teaspoonful pepper
- 1 clove
- 2 tablespoonfuls gelatine
- 1/2 cupful cold water
- Lettuce
- Mayonnaise
- Diced chicken
- Sliced cucumbers

Combine the canned tomato, celery sticks cut in pieces, chopped onions, salt, sugar, pepper and clove. Simmer one-half hour. Then strain. While hot, add the gelatine which has been soaked in the cold water. Arrange alternate layers of diced chicken and sliced cucumbers in a cold, wet mold. Pour the tomato mixture over all and chill until firm. Serve on lettuce with mayonnaise. Serves eight to ten.

FRUIT SALAD DRESSING

- 1/4 cupful mayonnaise
- 1/2 cupful cream

Whip the cream quite stiff and fold in the mayonnaise carefully. Serve with fruit salad.
