The Navy announced today that it has modified existing enlistment regulations so that candidates with one dependent may enlist in pay grades E-1 and E-2 (seaman recruit and seaman apprentice). Candidates with two or more dependents may enlist in pay grade E-3 (seaman).
Old requirements forbade enlistments in grades below petty officer if the candidate had any dependents.
