Playing At The Ivy Sunday

Romance, action and color with a background of wild horses add up to the brilliant outdoor film, "Sierra," with Audie Murphy and Wanda Hendrix heading a large cast.

The story centers around Murphy and his father, Dean Jagger, who has hidden out for fifteen years because he has been accused of a crime he didn't commit. Audie's only friend before Wanda comes along is Burl Ives, who in one scene sings a jailer to sleep so he can help Audie to escape.

Murphy and Miss Hendrix, after many tumultuous arguments, find themselves in love and wander off into the hills together.

SUNDAY and MONDAY —

Ray Milland emerges as a full-fledged western star in "Copper Canyon," which opens at the Ivy theater June 10.

Hedy Lamarr plays the sultry owner of a dance hall-saloon who falls in love with and joins Milland in his fight against the syndicate that controls the smelter.

MacDonald Carey portrays a ruthless gunman, while his namesake, Harry Jr. is seen as a soldier in the Union army. Mona Freeman also is included in the starring cast. This, incidentally, is one of the few romantic roles the lovely Miss Freeman has ever played.

TUESDAY and WEDNESDAY —
"Crisis," the story of an American brain specialist kidnapped in an unnamed Latin-American country fomenting with revolution, and forced to save the life of its hated dictator, brings Cary Grant, Jose Ferrer, Paula Raymond and a distinguished supporting cast to the Ivy screen in a drama that is teeming with action, adventure and absorbing suspense.

Grant gives a persuasive portrayal of the brain specialist who makes no bones about his hatred of tyranny and oppression and coming out victor in the end, while Jose Ferrer paints a brilliant picture of a man obsessed with power. Paula Raymond is excellent in the part of Ferguson's young bride, with the other principal feminine role, that of the dictator's coldly beautiful wife, played by Signe Hasso.

AND

High-calibered mystery is unrolled as a double-bill with "Crisis" in the exciting "Snow-dog," with Kirby Grant and Chinook, an all-white German Shepherd dog.

The always satisfying tempo of the screenplay gathers speed when the Mountie learns that a valuable map, belonging to one of the victims of the killer he is seeking, has been stolen. With the search now broadened to find both the slayers and the important map, and with the killer's gang stalking the Mountie, excitement reaches a high pitch and is well maintained until the surprise ending of the film.

THURSDAY and FRIDAY —

"No Way Out" tells unflinchingly of what happens when a warped criminal mind turns its blind hatred on an innocent man. Richard Widmark, a negro-hater and a hoodlum, is wounded and captured with his brother in a robbery, and when his brother dies Widmark lays the blame on Sidney Poitier, negro intern in the case.

Widmark refuses to believe the intern's innocence and from his hospital imprisonment, through a lowdown woman who was his brothers' wife and his own sweetheart, manages to instigate a race riot.
