The R. H. Holm family on the Redwood highway is expecting weekend friends from California.

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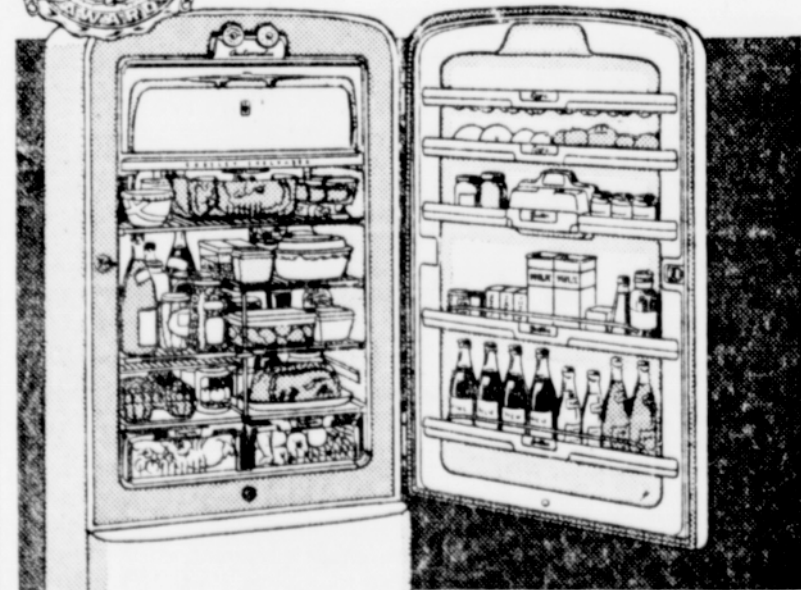
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
