

cup confectioners' sugar 4 teaspoon vanilla extract 1 pint ice cream (any flavor) 6 bakers' individual Mary Ann

Beat egg whites until stiff, but not dry Blend in confectioners' sugar and vanilla extract. Continue beating until meringue stands in peaks and is well blended. Divide ice cream into 6 portions. Place a portion of ice cream in the center of each Mary Ann shell. Cover Mary Ann shell and ice cream entirely with meringue. Place on a cookie sheet and brown quickly in a hot oven (450° F.) for approximately five minutes. Serve immediately.

NOTE: The Alaskas may be made up in advance and kept frozen in your home freezer or the freezing compartment of your refrigerator until ready to brown in the oven and serve.
