"SOUL and Body" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, November 25.


The Golden Text was, "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?" (1 Cor. 3:16).
