about how a stockman might get the most out of his pastures. Ben thinks that pasture rotation is a necessary step in getting the most from pastures because:

1. Cows graze with more vigor and consume more roughage.
2. Prevents much of the clumping.
3. Produces more feed per acre.
4. Gives the grass a chance to recover.
5. Prevents overgrazing in certain areas.

I might add that most of us have a tendency to over-graze, but to get the best results forage should be from 6 to 8 inches tall all the time. Pasture studies show twice as much yield per acre from areas cut every 14 days compared to those cut every week.

Now I may get the question of how pastures can be stripped for rotation grazing. About the simplest method I could think of to recommend would be the movable electric fence. This will allow rotation grazing at a low fence cost. Although some of us don't do it, I would say an electric controller must be used to protect children and livestock, then make sure all connections are good and insulate wire for good service, for grass touching the wire may cause a short.

Larger permanently fenced fields make forage harvesting easier. A movable electric fence solves the problem of making this large field into small areas that can be grazed off in not more than 3 days. I am sure once you try rotation grazing, you will agree with Ben and the rest of the fellows who practice it that it does pay off in meat and milk.

TOPSY-TURVEY OLD WORLD
Prices of crops have been edging upward in Oregon. Mid-February found grain and clover seed prices ranging from 4 to 25 percent above a year earlier, while apple and potato prices had nearly doubled.

Wool prices had been cut in half. Hog prices have skidded as much as 20 percent and sheep prices are down 14 percent. Lambs, beef cattle, and veal calves ranged from 4 to 8 percent below a year earlier.

They are still quite young. A good grain, either barley of wheat, plus 10 percent linseed oil meal is satisfactory creep feed and this formula many successful sheepmen use.

A creep is a compartment into which a small lamb can go and fro but which is small enough to bar the ewe. A creep can be put across the corner of a corral, inside a shed, or in any place where it will be handy. Grain can be fed in a wide bottom trough. Remove uneaten grain once daily to avoid digestion disturbances. This uneaten grain may be fed to ewes. Addition of grain where the ewe is not milking properly will make it possible to sell the lamb fat at weaning time.
