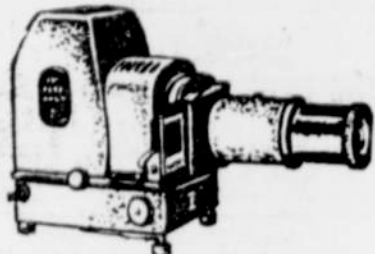

Artificial Breeding Explained to Lions

The improvements possible in the dairy industry through an artificial breeding program were explained to the Illinois Valley Lions club at the Todelope Tuesday night by Harold Hemingway.

The next meeting of the club will be a ladies night and installation of officers at the O'Brien Women's club. A Ford movie, "American Cowboy" will be shown.

Harold Hemingway is in charge of artificial breeding for the Illinois Valley Dairy Breeders Assn., a Valley dairy organization but three and one-half months old. The group has artificially bred about 100 cows during its beginning months of organization.

According to Hemingway artificial breeding can improve the blood line of dairy herds enough within four years to result in a production increase of about 20 to 25-percent. Artificial insemination is also considered an improvement over natural service as the conception rate of the former is about 74-percent compared to only 61-percent for natural breeding.

The Valley group is affiliated with the Oregon Dairy Breeders Assn., owners of outstanding jersey, guernsey and holstein sires.
