National Forest Timber For Sale

Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon, up to and not later than 2:00 P.M., Pacific Standard Time, August 11, 1952, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting, all the windthrown timber, all the beetle infested or susceptible timber; all the merchantable dead timber, standing or down, located on 7 acres totaling about 53 acres in and adjacent to the Wm. J. Sowell sale cutover areas and adjacent to the Southern Oregon Plywood Co. Sale cutover areas on Page Mountain in Sections 5, 6 and 7, T. 41 S., R. 7 W., W.M. in the Elder Creek drainage, South Fork Illinois River watershed, Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 599,000 bd. ft., more or less, of Douglas fir, 25,000 bd. ft., more or less, of Port Orford white-cedar, and 14,000 bd. ft., more or less, of white fir and other species of sawtimber. No bid of less than \$9.20 per M. bd. ft. for Douglas fir, \$10.70 per M. bd. ft. for Port Orford white-cedar, and \$3.55 per M. bd. ft. for white fir and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.65 per M. bd. ft., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. \$2500.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages according to the conditions of sale. No bond will be required. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the forest supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Cave Junction, Oregon, before bids are submitted. On Tuesday, August 5, at 10:00 A. M. a forest officer will be available at the Illinois Valley Ranger Station, Cave Junction, Oregon, to explain the terms of the sale and to conduct a tour to show the timber offered for sale.
