Funeral Held for Logging Mishap Victim

Funeral services for Ralph Sowell, 51, were held Tuesday, August 5, at the Cave Junction Community church.

Mr. Sowell was fatally injured July 26 when crushed by a falling tree. He was working alone in the woods at the time and the accident was not discovered until two hours later when his wife found him. He was taken to the Sacred Heart hospital in Medford where he died a week later, Aug. 2.

He was a son of Sarah and Joseph Sowell, early pioneers of the Illinois Valley. Mr. Sowell operated his own logging and mill operations.

He is survived by his widow, Sybil Nettie Sowell, a son, Lawrence Sowell of Merrill, and two step-sons, Bobby Gilliam of Cave Junction and Chester Gilliam, U.S. Navy; two sisters, Mrs. Lloyd Robinson of Cave Junction and Mrs. George Clark of Grants Pass; a brother Lee Sowell of Cave Junction; several nieces and nephews.

Interment was in the Laurel cemetery under the direction of Conger-Morris Funeral home in Medford, Rev. George Gray officiating.

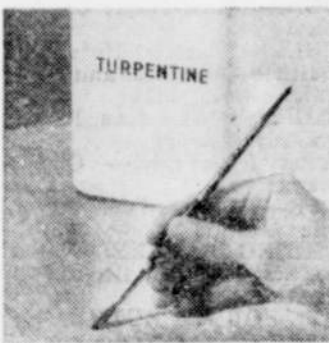
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HINTS for the Handyman NO. 7 REMOVING SCRATCHES

To remove shallow scratches or hair-line cracks, soften finish so it runs together—with alcohol for shellac, turpentine for paint or varnish, lacquer thinner for lacquer. Let dry 48 hours and rub smooth with rotten stone, clean and wax. Sometimes painting little scratches with iodine or rubbing with walnut meat will do the job. Wax of the right shade may suffice.

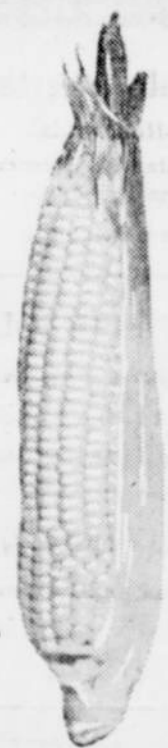
