Mr. and Mrs. Pete Blue have built a sun porch on their home. Mr. and Mrs. Buster Branham are having a well drilled at their place.

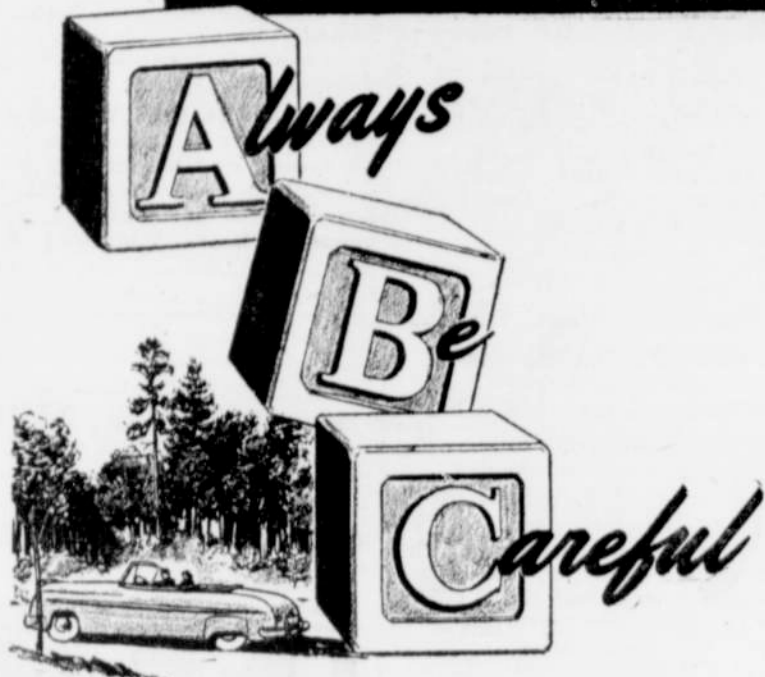
Dennis Krauss started his school year with an emergency trip to the hospital for an appendectomy.

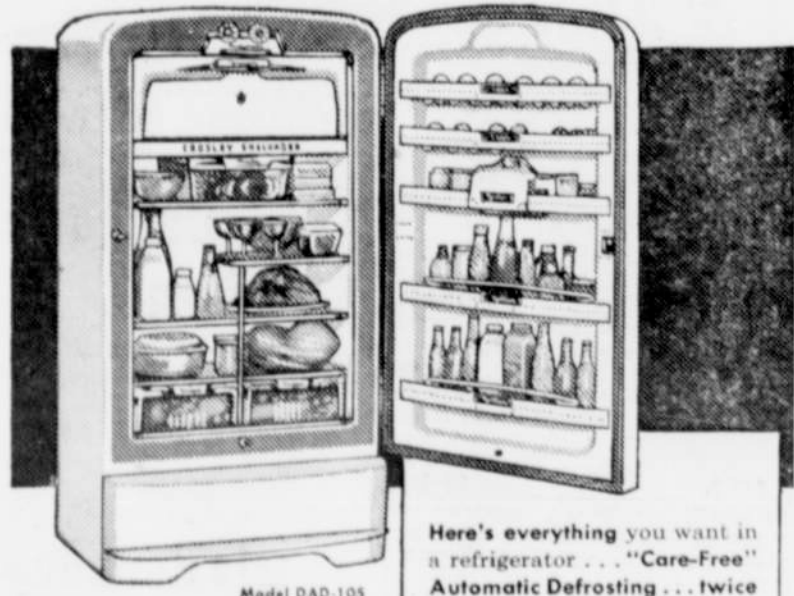

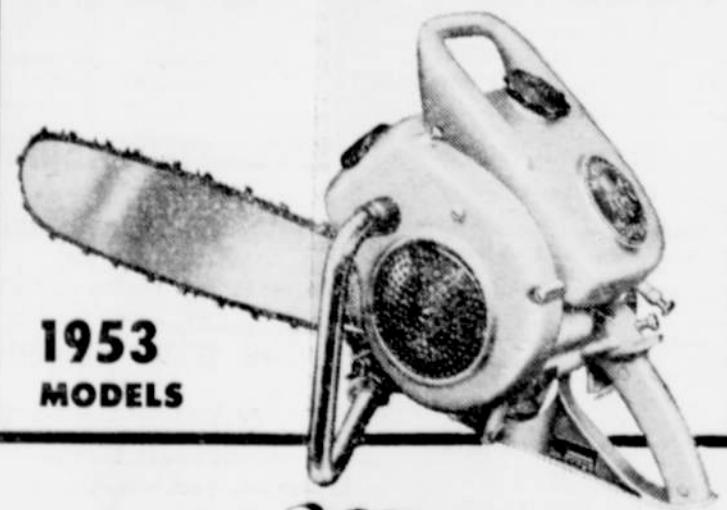
