CITY WATER

—Its Unfortunate Past

Six years ago your city faced a water shortage. Bonds were voted and sold to finance a municipal water system which never received state approval.

For \$55,000 the city should have a well, instead of just surface water and a more complete distribution system.

Several thousand dollars worth of the bond money was to be used for expansion of the system. The administration is unable to find any record of this money being used for expansion.

In 1949 and 1950 the council attempted to force the water user to buy his water meter. Is it not an unusual situation when the customer has to purchase the equipment with which his purchases are to be measured?

The present administration is not charging for meters, although a hook-up charge is made. The administration plans to buy back all meters that were sold.

The administration urges you to attend council meetings so you can become better familiarized with city problems and activities. The regular meetings are on the second Monday of the month. A discussion meeting is held the fourth Monday night.
