Introduced were Ruth Masters, worthy matron of Western Star chapter; Jonelle Bengé, honored

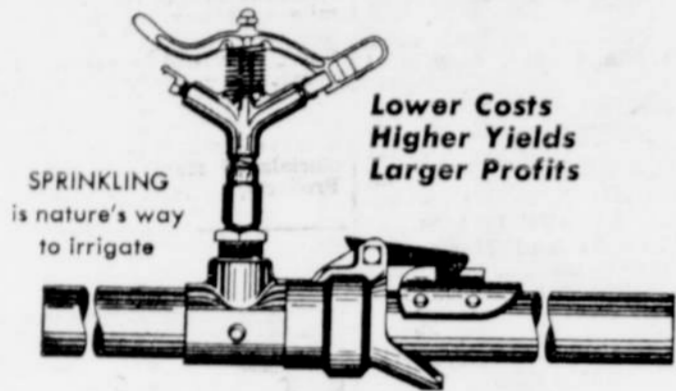
